PRWIN'S MANDATE

- To research, organize and participate in projects designed to improve and preserve the environment as it relates to the Pine River Watershed.
- To educate and increase the public's understanding of the Pine River Watershed and its importance by offering presentations, participating in conferences, meetings and disseminating information to the public on our website, newsletters and social media.
- To provide information to the public on programs and funding opportunities that will improve the water quality within the Pine River as it flows into Lake Huron.



In-ground Projects



COA 2021-22 Berm Project



- Two water and sediment control basins also know as "berms" were built up to control runoff on farmland in Huron-Kinloss. Our contractor redesigned the existing berms this fall.
- The "berms" structure reduces water and sediment run-off into local watercourses and reduces erosion.
 The berm will allow any sediment to settle out and will allow for infiltration through the soils. The waterway between the berms was re-contoured and seeded.
- Last spring, we planted over 6,000 cedars and spruce seedlings to reforest project sites in Huron-Kinloss. Seedlings sourced from Maitland Valley Conservation Authority.
- This project is supported by COA funding, a grant from Environment Canada.

2022 Spring Seedling Program

- In the spring of 2022, seedlings were handed out during our annual "FREE Seedling Give-Away Program." The selection of seedlings included white cedar, white spruce, Norway spruce, red pine, tamarack, silver maple, red oak, white oak, black cherry and black walnut. PRWIN Spring Seedling Program offered over 80 personal seedling orders.
- Donations and sponsorship for the seedlings were purchased from Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority.



In-ground Projects

2022 4-H Seedling Planting Day



- PRWIN organized a seedling planting day with the Ripley 4-H Conservation Club and community volunteers planting trees on a landowner's property in Huron-Kinloss.
- The 4-H Conservation Club planted 2000 white cedars along with a mix of Norway spruce and white pine.
- Also, PRWIN provided assistance to support the Ripley 4-H Conservation Club and Ripley 4-H Sheep Club.

PRWIN Outreach

McLarty Environmental Study Area



- This area is designed for our community to learn about the Pine River; wetland creation and the education of the local wildlife and plants that this area supports. PRWIN has installed a trail system throughout the area, created two wetland ponds, planted memorial trees, an osprey nest and planted over a thousand tree seedlings.
- Community groups have enjoyed outdoor classroom experiences at the McLarty location. The 4-H Conservation Club and the Ripley Horticultural Society For Our Youth have stopped by to enjoy nature along the river flats. Local youth groups, clubs and day camps are welcome to experience this opportunity.



PRWIN Outreach

Ripley 4-H Conservation Club



- PRWIN Directors and the 4-H Conservation Club teamed up to tidy up a mature reforestation site. The volunteers removed old white field tiles from the bottom of trees along a fence line, checked tree tubex for living/dead trees and fixed stakes to secure them for the thriving trees.
- Our groups worked together to spring-clean The McLarty Environmental Study Area. The volunteers removed tubex and stakes from mature trees, trimmed branches, cut grass for pathways, and assisted with spring maintenance of the picnic tables, bird houses and sheds.



PRWIN Outreach



- PRWIN hosted a Sponsorship Day to recognize our valuable sponsors at our Red Maple Reforestation site.
- PRWIN provides spring maintenance of rain garden at the Ripley Library.
- PRWIN Directors assisted MVCA by planting 200 white cedar seedlings at a farm near Holyrood.
- PRWIN sponsored community events: public skating, free tree raffle, participated in the Ripley Fall Fair Parade and created a video to exhibit our watershed to support the Ripley Huron Fall Fair Virtual Events.

- This summer, long time past PRWIN
 Chairperson/Director and volunteer, Jack Campbell
 passed away. Jack Campbell was a member with
 our organization for over 20 years. Jack was one of
 the co-founders of PRWIN when it was started in
 2000 and gave countless volunteer hours to our
 organization along with many other community
 groups.
- PRWIN Directors respected Jack and his vision for the Pine River Watershed. PRWIN would not be where we are today without his leadership and dedication to connect farm owners and cottagers to preserve our community watershed.



PRWIN Investment In Huron-Kinloss



- Our 2022 operation expenses was spent directly on projects, contract services, professional fees, programming, as well as education and outreach.
- The remainder of expenses provided administration, auditing and other overhead.
- Since 2013, when PRWIN started auditing with BDO Walkerton, over a million dollars has been invested in Huron-Kinloss alone on in-ground projects and programming by PRWIN.

Challenges:

- The COA (Canada Ontario Agreement) grant administered by MOECP was approved January 2022. This grant was our <u>only</u> funding source for projects in 2022. This funding was outlined for the following PRWIN budget:
 - \$20,000 for human resources.
 - \$30,000 for berm reconstruction and reforestation projects.
 - \$10,000 administered to SVCA for local water monitoring.
- PRWIN applied for funding in 2022. The ECO Action Community Fund Program and the OCEF grant application was not successful.
- Community Non-profit groups stated at a meeting it was a common theme that the most challenging funding to obtain is support for covering "Administrative Costs". Corporate donors want their funds to go directly to specific projects in the community.

Opportunities:

- PRWIN is contacting businesses to help fund projects and programming moving forward in 2023. We have a legacy fund and a sponsorship program.
- COA 2022-23 funding announcements are expected early in the new year. Our application is for a project off of Bruce County Road #7 just north of Ripley and potential reforestation sites.
