Calls for Service of Note

Violent Crime:

Assault – In comparing March and April to the previous year, there was an increase of 1 assault. 2 of the assaults were domestic in nature and the third was an assault on an emergency services worker.

Robbery – There was 1 robbery investigated over these 2 months which consisted of an attempted theft and a threat with a weapon. An individual was arrested and charged at the time.

Other Crimes Against a Person – These crimes generally include threatening behaviour. 1 of these investigations included threats uttered by a neighbour.

Property Crime:

Break and Enter – There were no break and enters reported or investigated in March and April of this year.

Theft Over – 1 of the theft over \$5000 was attributed to a stolen flat bed trailer in Huron-Kinloss. That investigation remains on-going.

Theft Under – There was a reduction in theft under \$5000. Of the 4 reported, 2 of them were as a result of property that had been borrowed by a friend and another involved a theft from an unlocked vehicle.

Traffic:

Traffic Enforcement / Education – Over the months of March and April, officers issued a total of 96 Provincial Offence Notices for a variety of Provincial Offences. Further to this, they issued 77 formal warnings for a variety of Provincial Offences.

Spring Seatbelt Campaign – From April 7 – 10 officers were highly visible conducting the Spring Seatbelt Campaign. Officers charged 4 individuals for not properly wearing their seatbelt restraints.

RIDE – Over the 2 months, officers conducted 32 RIDE checks in Huron-Kinloss.

Other:

Crime Stoppers – 1 tip specific to Huron-Kinloss was received from Crime Stoppers.

Foot Patrol – 36 hours of Foot Patrol were dedicated over the 2 months.

Training – During April a member attended training related to Investigating Offences Against Children. Further to this, a member attended a 2 week marine course to receive further certification as a Launch Operator.

MCRT – Over the 2 month period officers responded to 93 Mental Health related calls for service. Of these 93 calls for service, MCRT supported officers in 47 of them. In total, 44 individuals experiencing mental health concerns have been diverted away from the hospitals.

Detachment Updates:

In April, Retired Auxiliary Staff Sergeant Dennis Dick was recognized for over 20 years of volunteerism as an O.P.P. Auxiliary member. Over the 20 years he has made significant contributions to our communities and organization in this role.
