# Bruce County Public Library Introduces Seed Libraries

Bruce County Public Library (BCPL) is excited to offer new Seed Libraries – one in every municipality in Bruce County! These seed libraries offer access to seeds free charge to anyone interested in growing. By cultivating a collection of seeds locally adapted to the region these libraries can help preserve local Bruce County strains of plants and provide seeds that are more resilient to weather, soil nutrients, and local pests. This helps communities address food sustainability while building on the Library's role as a community sharing place.

There will also be a hydroponic unit coming to the Teeswater Branch shortly. The hydroponic unit will grow herbs, which patrons may come in and snip or grab a pre-cut bunch from staff. This offers a unique way to try some fresh herbs in your recipes.

While working on this initiative, Program Coordinator Nancy Kuhl experienced outstanding community support. "Putting the seed libraries together has truly been a community connection project. The generosity of local businesses in donating funds and supplies, local youth building the boxes to house the seed packages, and local community members donating extra and unused seeds has brought the libraries from idea to reality," said Kuhl. Support received consisted of a \$3,000 donation from NWMO toward the new hydroponic unit, seeds, and materials. The Saugeen Shores Senior School's grade 11 construction class made building the boxes to contain the seeds part of their curriculum for this term, building 37 boxes. There were also donations from Ontario-based seed companies Bruce Botanical Food Gardens, The Secret Garden, Ontario Seed Company, and contributions from BCPL patrons.

Seed Libraries are free to use with your BCPL card. Getting a card is easy, and ther is no charge. You can visit your local Branch to register, or sign up online at getacard.brucecounty.on.ca. Donating back to the Seed Library is not a requirement but there are labelled envelopes for patrons to return harvested seeds. New to gardening? Bruce County Public Library carries a large selection of books and other resources to help get you started, as well as in person and online events to help patrons learn about planting and harvesting seeds.

# **Paramedic Services Committee**

Committee approved the purchase of five Autopulse Automated CPR Machines, to be paid for using COVID funding if authorized and any unfunded amount be paid by utilizing Paramedic Services Reserves at a total cost of approximately \$88,476.35 + HST. Committee also approved the purchase an additional six Autopulse Automated CPR Machines at a cost of approximately \$98,290.42 + HST, to be paid from the Paramedic Services Reserves. The Zoll AutoPulse A-CPR board works wirelessly with the County's existing monitors and the Zoll AutoPulse also utilizes what is called "ShockSync" Technology. These technologies work together to wirelessly calculate when the heart is best able to respond to paramedic treatments such as defibrillation of the heart at the least measured impedance, "Optimal Time". # Saugeen First Nation Public Library Partners with BCPL and BCM&CC to Raise Awareness of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women.

Melissa Root from the Saugeen Nation Public Library and Resource Centre has bee working hard the past month organizing family and community from Saugeen for an important project. Together they have designed and sewn 20 ribbon skirts to be displayed at all seventeen Bruce County Public Library Branches and in the Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre for May and June. The mission behind this projectis to bring awareness to the estimated 4,000 Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and the continued risk they still face today. Melissa, her daughters, Eden and Courage Root, and community members Letitia Thompson, Jocelyn Roote, Tania Ritchie, Julie Brown, Michelle Puddester, Holly Fontaine, Theresa Root, Melissa Root, and Melanie Cameron, came together to sew these skirts in honour of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls.

Each ribbon skirt was created to represent a different story of their stolen sisters. It resulted in 20 unique designs that will be displayed with honour for residents and visitors to view. Before delivering the skirts to BCPL and BCM&CC, Melissa and her family performed a smudging ceremony to purify the skirts for their journey.

Sixty-three percent of Indigenous women have experienced violence, and nearly half have experienced sexual assault, as reported by Statistics Canada in 2022. While the Native Women's Association of Canada's research shows that Indigenous Women and Girls accounted for 10% of all female homicides since 1980 while only making up 4%

of the population. This year the House of Commons has declared the deaths and disappearances of Indigenous Women and Girls a Nationwide emergency.

# NOTICE: Bruce County Begins Spring and Summer Transportation & Environmental Services Maintenance Projects

Please take notice the Bruce County Transportation & Environmental Services department will be undertaking a number of spring and summer infrastructure maintenance projects around the County. This work will include line painting, road construction, culvert replacement, and roadside mowing and maintenance.

Please take notice the Bruce County Transportation & Environmental Services department will be undertaking a number of spring and summer infrastructure maintenance projects around the County. This work will include line painting, road construction, culvert replacement, and roadside mowing and maintenance. The public is asked to be patient and drive safely as road workers and contractors complete this important infrastructure work in Bruce County.

Please take notice that the Bruce County line painting contractor will be conducting line painting operations on County Roads for the 2023 season from mid-May to Mid-June. This notice is to inform drivers to obey all signage and warning signs to keep their vehicles clean and clear of all roadway paint. Bruce County assumes no responsibility for paint damage claims from motorists who cross wet paint lines.

### When does line painting occur?

Line painting may be completed on County Roads in the mid-day, evening, or night-time hours when weather and conditions are appropriate.

### Why don't line painters just paint at night?

The difficulty with painting at night arises when the temperature between the air and the road surface change at different rates. Condensation can occur on the roadway, making for poor conditions for paint to adhere to the roadway.

### How long does it take for line paint to dry?

Dependent upon conditions, line paint can remain wet for up to 15 minutes.

### Paint operations are causing traffic backups, can we pass the warning trucks?

The intent of the warning trucks behind the line painter is to provide enough space in between to allow for paint to dry. If you cross the centerline to pass line painting operations, chances are that your vehicle will end up with paint on it. Please be patient and follow the direction of the notification signage.

### If I cannot remove paint from my vehicle, is the Municipality responsible?

Bruce County assumes no liability for paint damages to vehicles that have crossed wet paint lines or disobeyed the warning signs and warning vehicles.

# NOTICE: Idle Fee Parking Charge for County EV Charging Stations

Bruce County will be implementing an 'Idle Fee Parking Charge' effective Saturday, May 13, 2023 for all Bruce County owned EV charging stations.



# May 11, 2023

Bruce County will be implementing an 'Idle Fee Parking Charge' effective Saturday, May 13, 2023 for all Bruce County owned EV charging stations.

Once a vehicle is charged, the EV owner will have a 20-minute grace period to move. If the vehicle is not moved within 20 minutes of the charge being completed, their account/credit card will be charged \$0.50 per minute.

This measure has been implemented to deter vehicles from being left at charging stations for long periods of time (overnight and continuously over weekends).

A "Parking Charge Fee" notification will be displayed on the EV charging station displays. Frequent users receive notifications, through the charging station app, of any new changes for EV stations they have previously used.

Bruce County EV charging stations are currently available at the Bruce County Administration Centre (30 Park Street, Walkerton), the Peninsula Hub (268 Bedford Street, Wiarton), the Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre (33 Victoria Street, Southampton), and the Penetangore Hub (529 Gary Street, Kincardine).

Residents and visitors are reminded to be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours. If an emergency happens, it may take emergency workers some time to reach you, so get prepared now to face a range of emergencies anytime and anywhere. Be Ready for Anything!

Emergency Preparedness Week is May 7 to May 13 in Bruce County. Residents and visitors are reminded to be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours. If an emergency happens, it may take emergency workers some time to reach you, so get prepared now to face a range of emergencies anytime and anywhere. Be Ready for Anything!

Know the Risks - In Bruce County, higher risk hazards include severe weather, floods, and power outages. Knowing the risks in your region can help you better prepare.

Make a Plan - Every household needs an emergency plan. Your family may not be together when an emergency occurs. Plan

where to meet or how to contact one another. Discuss what you would do in different situations.

Get an Emergency Kit - Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Include basic items like food, water, and a battery-operated or crank flashlight. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Make sure your kit is portable, organized, accessible, and that everyone in the household knows where it is.

### **Get Prepared:**

- Draw up a floor plan of your home that shows all possible exits from each room. Plan a main exit route and an alternate exit route from each room.
- Identify an evacuation route from your neighbourhood in case you need to leave in a hurry.
- Identify safe places where everyone should meet if you cannot go home or you need to evacuate.
- Make copies of important documents and keep them somewhere safe.
- Ask your children's school or daycare about their emergency policies and procedures.
- Make a plan for your pets in case of evacuation. Keep in mind that not all locations are pet-friendly.
- Make a neighbourhood safety plan and work with your neighbours to identify people who may need extra help during an emergency.

In an emergency, follow your emergency plan, get your emergency kit, make sure you are safe before assisting others, listen to the radio or television for information from authorities and follow their instructions, and stay put until all is safe or until you are ordered to evacuate.







Please take notice that Bruce County intends to control Noxious weeds along the following County roadsides: BR33, BR40, BR10, BR14, BR8, BR9, BR5, BR13 and the Grey Bruce Line.

The following pesticides will be used, which are registered under the Pest Control Products Act (Canada):

Navius FLEX Herbicide (Reg. #30922) containing the active ingredients Metsulfuron – methyl and Aminocyclopyrachlor. Hasten NT Spray Adjuvant (Reg. #28277) containing the active ingredients methyl and ethyl oleate (esterified vegetable oil).

ClearView Herbicide (Reg.#29752) containing the active ingredients Aminopyralid (present as potassium salt), and Metsulfuron-methyl.

We are controlling noxious weeds under Public Works Exception to the Cosmetic Pesticides Ban for the promotion of public health or safety.

Spraying will commence on May 29, 2023, weather permitting, and conclude July 15, 2023.
