






Throughout May, Community Living Month, we shared videos of supported community members as they spoke about the impact belonging to school, social and extra curricular groups, and church communities, have on their lives.

## Madison, Member of the Canadian Air Cadets







When Madison Forster turned 12 years old, she decided she wanted to join the Canadian Air Cadets. On 24th Feb 2020 she stepped tentatively into the Kincardine Legion, not really knowing what to expect, to join the 183 Typhoon Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron. Madison has not looked back since that day; "I have not regretted a single moment."

Now, at 16, she has worked her way up through multiple ranks. Starting with air cadet, to: leading air cadet, corporal, flight corporal, and now: sergeant. She has set her sights high to aim for flight sergeant next!

"I am very proud of myself because I like getting promoted - who doesn't?!" said Madi.

Madi really enjoys the challenges that come with the role of a sergeant: "We are considered seniors; we have lessons on teamwork and leadership. We are also role models. We check that uniforms are on properly, rules are being followed, and all heck's not breaking loose. I lead lessons and at the most recent one I taught the Nato phonetic alphabet. For this, I needed to memorize it all! I really enjoyed teaching it."

In choosing the Royal Canadian Air Cadets, Madi decided to join over 25,000 youth from across Canada. Madi said, "I would highly recommend it to others; it's a great program to be in. You get to try lots of different activities. If everything goes to plan and I get accepted, I have applied for a training camp for advanced aviation, so I can get one step closer to my pilots' license. Wouldn't that be cool to be able to fly my family around?!"

Civilian Instructor, Robert Grey, explained, "Madi is waiting to hear about her advanced aviation course, which is a prep course for a glider pilot course. Although there is a lot of competition, we are hoping she gets a place."

Madi has increased her skills in many areas, such as: survival skills, physical fitness, public speaking, citizenship, and precision drills. However, Madi feels "the skills I have improved the most are definitely organization and leadership - don't get me wrong, my room is always a mess, but it has certainly gotten better!"

When asked about Madi's achievements in the platoon, Grey reported, "When Madi first joined, she was really shy, and now she is very sure of herself. Her attendance is impeccable; she has highest attendance of all cadets. I like her attitude - it's very positive. We encourage cadets to aim high, and Madi has certainly done that. She has achieved a lot in the time she has been with us."

Madi explained that a big part of the cadets was the feeling of camaraderie. "I look forward to seeing my cadets every week because they are like my other family. All the brothers, sisters, and even that awkward cousin. There is a real sense of belonging. Everyone helps everybody. We are always watching each other's backs. I feel like part of the cadet family."

Madi really wanted to emphasize the importance of the organizational team that makes the program so effective, "Lots of things go on in the background and behind the scenes, and there are lots of volunteers, civilian instructors and officers who support us. Without them, we wouldn't be able to do this. So, I thank everyone who helps make it so successful."

#### What's Going On...at RTO7

#### Tourism SkillsNet7 (TSN7)

In collaboration with Destination Northern Ontario (DNO), Nature and Outdoor Tourism Ontario (NOTO) and the Ontario Tourism Education Corporation (OTEC), Regional Tourism Organization 7 (RTO7) representing BruceGreySimcoe has partnered to expand Tourism SkillsNet North – an initiative designed to identify workforce labour gaps and match job seekers with available job opportunities within the tourism sector in Northern Ontario will now be available in BruceGreySimcoe.

Regional Tourism Organization 7 will work to connect employees hired after April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, and prospective employees with free training provided virtually by project partner OTEC (Ontario Tourism Education Corporation). Additionally, Regional Tourism Organization 7 will work with employment service providers in Bruce, Grey, and Simcoe counties to match prospective employees with available job opportunities within Region 7's tourism sector.

For employees hired after April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, while the training is free, qualified employers will be eligible for a 50% wage subsidy for up to 10 employees. This subsidy is capped at:

- Seasonal employer (new TSN7 job seeker/employee): \$3,000
- Seasonal employer or year-round employer (returning TSNN job seeker/employee): \$2,500
- Year-round employer (new TSN7participant/employee): \$5,000

#### A Message from the Ministry of Health

Update on COVID-19 rapid antigen testing programs: Provincial Antigen Screen Program (PASP)

The temporary Provincial Antigen Screening Program (PASP) played a pivotal role in the province's emergency pandemic response by providing people with easy access to free rapid antigen tests (RATs) when COVID-19 infection volumes were at their peak and extensive access to testing was essential to stopping its spread.

With the lower rates of COVID-19, high vaccination rates, and demand for RATs consistently decreasing, the province will be winding down its RAT programs on June 30, 2023.

In advance of the June 30, 2023, program end date, participants from the tourism,

culture and sport sectors are encouraged to place final orders. These orders should consider historical usage rates and preparedness for the upcoming fall/winter respiratory season. The last order date will be June 16, 2023.

- Final order volumes would be subject to any maximum amounts specified in your organization's agreement, if applicable, or otherwise left to the Ministry's discretion.
- After June 30, 2023, program participants are expected to distribute all remaining RATs received through their respective programs free of charge.

Unused or expired tests cannot be returned to any central government warehouse due to quality control considerations. Program participants are encouraged to review the Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks (MECP) guidelines regarding the proper and safe disposal of waste from RATs, including unused and/or expired RAT kits. Information on manufacturer expiry date extensions can be found on the Ontario Health website.

Ontario's COVID-19 testing strategy will increasingly focus on molecular testing tools, which can be accessed at pharmacies and many other locations across Ontario. Individuals who qualify for testing can find a location close to them at https://www.ontario.ca/assessment-centre-locations.

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## FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

## **June 2023**

It's hard to believe we're six months into the year. Just a few months ago the Clean Energy Frontier program opened a conversation about nuclear sector retention and expansion. I'm pleased to say the Nuclear Sector Sustainability and Growth Study is now complete, and reports have been delivered to two stakeholders: Bruce Power and economic development leaders for the tri-counties of Bruce, Grey and Huron.



During the process of interviews and roundtable discussions, suppliers were asked about workforce, business development, and their experience of doing business in the region. And the results reminded us there are a lot of **advantages** to doing business in the Clean Energy Frontier region. There are barriers, too—and this is where we can get to work.

Bruce Power and the tri-counties have an opportunity to continue our collaborative effort. The barriers identified in the study will **need the time and attention** of the nuclear industry, elected officials and municipal staff. There are action items coming from this study that **align** with what we heard at the 2023 Clean Energy Frontier Summit event in Walkerton this January. With these findings in hand, we are informed and willing to take action toward **retention and expansion** efforts for the nuclear sector.



## **Beyond the sector study...**

The Clean Energy Frontier program is pleased to continue engagement with elected officials. On June 28th, we will welcome elected officials from Bruce, Grey and Huron and Regional Steering Committee members to the Bruce Power Visitors' Centre. The group will experience the always-informing Bruce Power Bus Tour and hear a presentation from the Clean Energy Frontier Program. ## GBPH issues opioid alert following series of drug poisonings

Grey Bruce Public Health is urging people to exercise extreme caution when using unregulated street drugs after receiving reports of four suspected opioid overdoses – including a fatal overdose – over a recent six-day period.

An individual in their 50s died June 21, 2023, of a suspected fentanyl overdose, while non-fatal overdoses were reported between June 16 and 21, 2023. Each of the overdoses occurred in the Owen Sound area.

All unregulated street drugs carry a high risk of toxicity, posing a potential threat to life. These drugs may be unknowingly adulterated or mixed with hazardous substances, such as fentanyl or carfentanil, both of which lack odor and taste. Even a minuscule amount of fentanyl or carfentanil can have lethal consequences.

"In order to prioritize the well-being and safety of individuals, it is crucial to address the significant risks associated with the use of unregulated substances, which can lead to drug poisoning due to the inherent toxicity of the local drug supply," says Dr. Rim Zayed, Physician Consultant at Grey Bruce Public Health.

"We urge individuals who engage in the consumption of street drugs to exercise utmost caution and take proactive measures to ensure their awareness of the substances they are consuming. This includes being well-informed about the type, dosage, and origin of the substances."

GBPH is also emphasizing that drug toxicity can affect individuals from all walks of life, irrespective of their age, gender, or prior history of drug use. The risks associated with unregulated substances transcend demographic boundaries and should be approached with utmost care and concern.

People who use drugs should <u>never use alone</u> and always carry a naloxone kit. If it's not possible to use with someone present, call the National Overdose Response

Service at **1-888-688-6677.** A NORS operator will stay on the line while the drug is being used. In the event the caller becomes unresponsive, the operator will call 911.

If you suspect someone is experiencing a drug poisoning, administer naloxone. This may improve breathing, but may not help the individual regain consciousness. It is important to call 911 and continue to monitor breathing until medical help arrives.

Free naloxone kits are available at participating pharmacies in Grey-Bruce, Grey Bruce Public Health, and via GBPH's community partners.

Public Health advises people who use drugs to:

- Go Slow. Always start with a low dose and increase slowly, especially if trying something new or restarting use.
- Take extra caution if mixing substances. Mixing substances can increase the risk of harm and drug poisonings.
- **Use only new supplies.** This reduces the risk of getting or passing on an infectious disease. Supplies are available at GBPH and community partners.

Overdose is a medical emergency. Call 911 or go to the Emergency Department. The Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act provides protection from simple possession charges when 911 is called for an overdose.

GBPH urges community partners and the public to report unexpected bad reactions to non-prescribed drugs. Reports can be made over the phone by calling 211 or online using the 211 Report a Bad Drug web form. Reporting drug overdoses/poisonings enables Grey Bruce Public Health to issue timely alerts to its partners and people who use drugs about potential hazards.

## Public Health holding clinics to help students get up to date on routine vaccines

Grey Bruce Public Health will be holding vaccination clinics this summer for students who are entering senior kindergarten to Grade 5 in September and require one or more publicly funded, routine vaccines.

The clinics, which will be held in Owen Sound and Hanover, are part of Public Health's ongoing and focused efforts to support students in getting up to date on routine vaccines, prevent school suspensions, and increase the percentage of students meeting the requirements of Ontario's Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA).

"Vaccines are a safe, effective way to protect students, their families, and communities from potentially serious infectious diseases. Having high vaccination rates among students is also the best way to prevent outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases at our schools," says Dr. Rim Zayed, Physician Consultant at GBPH.

"During the COVID-19 emergency, many students fell behind on routine vaccines. While we encourage students to get any overdue vaccines from their primary care provider, Public Health will be holding clinics to assist students who may not have a provider or are experiencing challenges with getting an appointment so they can catch up on the vaccines they need before school resumes."

Vaccine clinics for students born between 2013 and 2018 will be held July 27 and Aug. 23 at the Grey Bruce Public Health building in Owen Sound and July 19 and Aug. 17 at the P&H Centre in Hanover. Clinics will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

To assist parents who work during the day, Public Health will also be extending to 6 p.m. the hours of its June 22 vaccine clinic at the GBPH building in Owen Sound.

Ontario's Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule outlines the routine vaccines that all children and adolescents without a valid exemption must receive to attend primary or secondary school. The ISPA mandates Public Health Units to maintain and review immunization records for every student attending school within their jurisdiction and enforce a suspension for students with incomplete vaccine information or overdue immunizations unless a medical or non-medical exemption is in place.

Grey Bruce Public Health is making every effort to assist parents in preventing their child from being suspended from school due to a missed vaccine or incomplete record. Letters with information on any missed vaccines and how to update immunization records were sent to parents whose children require vaccinations. Public Health is also using social media, its website, and other communication tools to advise parents of ISPA requirements and where routine vaccines are available.

Parents/guardians whose children are up to date on all required vaccines are asked to ensure their immunization records with Public Health are also updated. Immunization information can be accessed and updated using the online ICON tool: ICON Link.

Along with the student clinics, GBPH will be holding regular vaccine clinics throughout the summer for anyone needing a publicly funded vaccine. A <u>calendar of clinics</u> is available on the GBPH website.

The ROMA Board met in Prince Edward County this month, providing an opportunity to learn about creative local initiatives that are helping to address challenges like housing, economic development and social services:


- <u>Thrive Prince Edward County</u> shared how it is working to revitalize community and economic development initiatives in the County through strong partnerships and a collaborative organization.

Many councillors will know that on May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the government voted down Bill 5 – The Stopping Harassment and Abuse by Local Leaders Act. We are writing to call on your municipality to be an active and engaged voice in our own workplace safety and that of the municipal staff by joining 166 other Ontario municipalities in supporting legislation to hold municipally elected representatives accountable for violence and harassment. In 2021, the Association of Municipalities Ontario recommended changes to strengthen municipal codes of conduct for elected officials. Those recommendations to strengthen legislation have still not been implemented. Codes of Conduct, Changes to Visible Fees, and Fees Charged to Beverage Producers | AMO

We are asking council to pass the attached motion of March 27, 2023, issued by AMO, calling for government legislation on this issue. We are requesting the motion include the communication that this legislation be prioritized for the fall of 2023 given the urgency of this issue. We are asking that a letter expressing support for the motion be sent to: The Premier, Local MPPs, Minister of Municipal Affairs, Associate Minister of Women's Social and Economic Opportunity, AMO and local municipalities.
