



Boiler Beach Restoration & Planting 2023





In April 2023, the Community Services Department along with community organizations and residents, planted:

- 160 Spreading Junipers
- 20 Norway Spruce
- 5 Red Oak

The planting took about 3 hours and stretched about a 500m along Boiler Beach between Concession 10 and Concession 12.






The Community Services Department maintains 23 parks and green spaces throughout Huron-Kinloss.

We have 4 baseball diamonds - Ripley, Point Clark, Reid's Corners and KinBruce.

Lucknow has 2 baseball diamonds, but they are maintained by the Lucknow Recreation Department.

Community Services maintains the Ripley-Huron Community Centre, the Point Clark Community Centre, the Point Clark Lighthouse and the Lucknow Town Hall.










Attawandaron Park & Deer Run Trail

Where Have All the Ash Trees Gone?



The Ash Tree Replacement Program

The emerald ash borer is an invasive insect that was first discovered in Ontario in June 2002.

The beetle likely crossed into Ontario at Windsor after establishing in the Detroit area, where it probably arrived in wood packaging or pallets.

Infestations now exist across much of southern Ontario, including Huron-Kinloss. Emerald ash borer feeds on all ash species in Ontario, including green, red, white, black and blue ash.

Due to this invasive insect, the Community Services has had to remove around 8,000 trees within the last 10 years throughout the township, mostly along Lake Range Drive/Concession 2.



Ripley Dog Park & Lewis Park Pavilion

Point Clark Community Centre

Point Clark Community Centre is located at 344 Lake Range Drive. It was built in 1988 and over the years has been the home for many weddings, wedding receptions, family holidays, funerals, senior's recreation and much more.

The Huron Lakeshore Friendship Club are major supporters of the Point Clark Community Centre and offer wonderful weekly senior's programs.

In 2023, we applied for a Senior's Grant to purchase a new stage, sound system and marketing materials for their programs.

Unfortunately, we were not successful in obtain the grant.





Ripley-Huron Community Centre

The Ripley-Huron Community Centre is located at 17 Queen St., in Ripley. The facility features a large ice pad, dressing rooms, grand stands, social room, public health inspected kitchen and an auditorium, which is also a warm, upstairs viewing area for hockey games and skating competitions. The Social Room, Auditorium and Arena Floor can be rented out for a meeting space, family gatherings, funeral luncheons, baby showers, birthday parties and much more!

The Ripley-Huron Community Centre is a fully licensed facility.






Ripley-Huron Community Centre Renovation 2023

In 2022, the Township of Huron-Kinloss received the Ontario Trillium Grant for \$500,000 for major improvements to the Ripley-Huron Community Centre that include:


- 2 new, small and accessible dressing rooms

In April 2023, during a massive rain storm, the Ripley-Huron Community Centre was flooded, with damage done to facilities' main floor.

Restoration included, new flooring, new partitions in the bathrooms and repainting the walls.


