



Local Students Compete in GIS StoryMap Contest

In recognition of GIS Day, held annually in November, Bruce County and Grey County collaborated to offer a GIS contest for local schools. GIS Day celebrates the power of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) — a scientific framework for gathering, analyzing and visualizing geographic data to help us make better decisions.



November 30, 2022

Grade 7 and 8 students across Bruce and Grey counties competed in a GIS Day contest, where three finalists were recognized for their outstanding work in solving real-world, local geography issues using the GIS platform.

In recognition of <u>GIS Day</u>, held annually in November, Bruce County and Grey County collaborated to offer a GIS contest for local schools. GIS Day celebrates the power of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) — a scientific framework for gathering, analyzing and visualizing geographic data to help us make better decisions.

The contest, sponsored by Esri Canada and Bruce Power, challenged students to answer one of two questions in the form of an ArcGIS StoryMap, produced using the cloud-based GIS platform named ArcGIS Online. With over 420 students from 17

classrooms at nine schools — five in the Bluewater District School Board and four in the Bruce-Grey Catholic District School Board — students worked in teams to collectively submit 98 StoryMaps for judging.

To share their passion and career paths—and inspire students about geography and real-world applications of GIS, staff from Bruce Power, Municipality of Kincardine, Town of Saugeen Shores, and Bruce and Grey Counties formed a Bruce-Grey GIS Day Organizing Committee, serving as expert support for classrooms throughout the contest period and as judges.

Bruce County Public Library Participates in The Forest of Reading Program

Bruce County Public Library is bringing Canada's largest recreational reading progrators to Bruce County on December 1. The Forest of Reading program typically has upwards of 270,000 participants annually. The program consists of six categories the cater to children of all ages, from Kindergarten to grade 12.

Each category includes ten popular titles, and participants are required to read five before being eligible to vote for their favourite. The picture book category, Blue Spruce, is aimed at children from Kindergarten to grade 2 and is the only category where they must read all ten titles. Once completed, students will then vote for their favourite before the April 30 end date.

This year BCPL is working to engage local schools to register as a group through Beanstack. Beanstack is a free service provided by BCPL. It is a fun way to track your reading, complete challenges and win prizes.

The Forest of Reading program will be running Forest Fridays, where nominees will host 30 minute virtual visits that you can connect to at home, in the classroom, or at the Library. There will also be a series of activities that students can participate in and earn virtual badges.

Library Director, Brooke McLean, hopes The Forest of Reading program will follow the success of their Summer Reading Club. 'This summer, Bruce Country Public Library recorded record-breaking numbers for Summer Reading Club. The Forest of Reading

is a unique way to engage children over the winter months and continue to help build a lifelong love of reading in Bruce County.'

Don't Text and Drive! Distracted driving is a serious safety issue that has claimed lives. Every driver has a responsibility to focus on the road, traffic, and driving conditions. Pull over to communicate and don't put yourself and others at risk. Texting and driving is against the law.

Prepare for quickly changing conditions by having working winter tires, windshield wipers, and washer fluid. Stock your vehicle Emergency kit with a shovel, blanket, booster cables, flashlight, and more. Check road conditions and give yourself extra travel time.

Avoid collisions by removing all snow and ice from your roof and windows, ensure windshield wipers are in working order, turn taillights on, reduce speed, leave extra space, avoid sudden braking and accelerating. Slippery conditions require caution. See and be seen!

Deciding to pass is a serious decision. Use your turn signals, consider conditions and obstacles, and look for approaching vehicles and vehicles passing from behind. Pavement lines are simply a guide and could be snow-covered. When there is ice and snow, take it slow.

Don't veer for deer or other animals. Brake firmly but stay in your lane. Collisions occur when a driver swerves and loses control. Be on the lookout, prepare for the unexpected, and slow down in areas marked with animal activity signs.

When there's ice and snow, be patient and take it slow. Snow plow equipment travels at 25km/hr to 60km/hr working to keep roads safe. Passing a snow plow is never encouraged. If you pass, ensure adequate distance, road conditions, and space to return.

Protect emergency services personnel responding to incidents on the roadside. Slow down and proceed with caution when an emergency vehicle or tow truck is roadside with lights activated. Obey the law, move over, and stay safe! Offenders may get fines or demerit points.

Police close roads for safety. Do not drive on closed roads. In a whiteout, don't stop on the roadway. Find a driveway or parking lot to pull into. Vehicles parked or abandoned on roadways can be towed and fined. For winter road conditions, call 1-866-266-7569

Slow-moving horse-drawn vehicles are common in our area. When passing from behind or the opposite direction, slow down and create as much distance as possible. Don't use your horn or pass too closely. This may dangerously startle the horse. Expect the unexpected!

To drive or not to drive in wintery weather is a big decision. Ask yourself do you really need to travel, is it safe, and is it worth the risk? It's OK to stay where you are. Abandoned vehicles could be towed and fined. For road conditions, call 1-866-266-7569.
