On Saturday, September 30, 2023, Bruce County will solemnly observe the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also known as Orange Shirt Day. This day serves as a significant opportunity for all Canadians to acknowledge, remember, and contemplate the tragic history and lasting impact of residential schools on Indigenous people and communities.



September 28, 2023

On Saturday, September 30, 2023, Bruce County will solemnly observe the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, also known as Orange Shirt Day. This day serves as a significant opportunity for all Canadians to acknowledge, remember, and contemplate the tragic history and lasting impact of residential schools on Indigenous people and communities. We encourage residents, businesses, and staff to enhance their understanding of the residential school system through education and to wear an orange shirt in honor of the survivors and in memory of those who did not.

Throughout September, the "Every Child Matters" flag has been flown at prominent County locations. On Saturday, September 30, it will be respectfully lowered to half-mast.

In pursuit of our ongoing reconciliation efforts, Bruce County is committed to an Indigenous Reconciliation Planning Initiative. This initiative seeks to promote Indigenous cultural awareness and intercultural competency within the County, with the goal of developing a collaborative Indigenous Reconciliation Plan.

In September, the Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre, in partnership with various organizations, facilitated several impactful initiatives. These efforts included hosting Kairos Blanket Exercises with the support of Canadian Heritage (September 21, 22 & 23), the creation of a special ribbon skirt display for Orange Shirt Day, donated by Saugeen First Nation Library, and active participation in Truth and Reconciliation activities at GC Huston Public School and Saugeen First Nation's Minjimendaamin (We Remember) bridge gathering event. Furthermore, the museum collaborated with organizations such as the Legacy of Hope Foundation, Saugeen Ojibway Nation, and more to unveil the compelling 'Youth on Reconciliation' exhibition, showcasing artistic works and poems from Imagine a Canada competition winners, offering valuable insights into the significance of Reconciliation for Canada's youth. This exhibition is further supported by community members from the Chippewas of Saugeen and Chippewas of Nawash for a more personal perspective on the exhibit and deeper insights through conversation to better understand Truth before Reconciliation - each Wednesday from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Additionally, the Bruce County Public Library is honoured to have Priscilla Yellowhead Tobey at the Wiarton Branch at 11:00 AM on Thursday, September 28 and at the Tobermory Branch at 1:00 PM on Friday, September 29 for an excellent opportunity to learn more about the local Indigenous communities and the meaning behind reconciliation. Residents are also welcome to visit any of the 17 BCPL branches to add orange shirt-themed activities to the interactive displays outlining several calls to action taken from the Truth and Reconciliation report. Works by Indigenous authors will be showcased in the branches and can be borrowed with your BCPL Library card.

About Orange Shirt Day

Orange Shirt Day is a movement to recognize the colonial legacy of residential schools and commit to the ongoing process of reconciliation. Observed since 2013, Orange Shirt Day recalls the experience of residential school survivor Phyllis Webstad, who at six years old was stripped of her brand-new bright orange t-shirt, in favour of mandatory uniforms, on her first day at a residential school in 1973. Ms. Webstad's story is the nucleus for what has become a national movement to recognize the experience of survivors of Indian residential schools, honour them, and show a collective commitment to ensure that every child matters. The initiative calls for every Canadian to wear an orange shirt on September 30 in the spirit of healing and reconciliation. The date of September 30 was chosen because it was the time of year when Indigenous children were removed from their families and forced to attend residential schools.

Over the next two years, the new Community Development Office will focus on projects like Housing Supply in Bruce County, Growth of the Clean Energy and Medical Isotope Sectors, the Deep Geological Repository in South Bruce, and Pre-Development of the New Nuclear Reactor at Bruce Power.



October 02, 2023

On Thursday, September 7, 2023, Bruce County Council approved the creation of the new Community Development Office, which is a key piece in Bruce County's organizational restructuring and strategic planning.

There are several large-scale and complex projects emerging within Bruce County that require coordinated, strategic County leadership and focused resources. Over the next two years, the new Community Development Office will focus on projects like Housing Supply in Bruce County, Growth of the Clean Energy and Medical Isotope Sectors, the Deep Geological Repository in South Bruce, and Pre-Development of the New Nuclear Reactor at Bruce Power.

Each of these projects has the potential to positively impact the growth, development, and economic well-being of the County and its residents. The success of each of these projects requires significant and coordinated effort between County Programs and municipal partners, to create the right environment for achieving project and community success, and to prepare for the service delivery demands each project generates.

Current Director of Planning & Development, Claire Dodds, will become Bruce County's Commissioner for the new Community Development Office. Claire will lead crossfunctional, multi-disciplinary teams drawing on existing staff resources to ensure strategic oversight, with the coordination of input, execution of projects, and alignment of services to support projects. The Community Development Office will also take on delivery of the important Economic Development portfolio, focus on partnership strengthening with Chippewas of Saugeen, Chippewas of Nawash, the Historic Saugeen Metis, and the Metis Nation of Ontario, and collaborate with Bruce County's Intergovernmental Office to advocate for support from provincial and federal levels of government. Jack Van Dorp, on secondment, will become Bruce County's Director of Planning and Development for the next two years. The Planning portfolio will continue to focus on Development, Land Use Planning, and Employment Services.

"Large-scale projects, like increasing housing supply or growing our nuclear industry, will positively impact community development in Bruce County," said Warden Chris Peabody. "Through the new Community Development Office, we will be at the table early and actively, engaging with project proponents, developers, and municipal partners to prepare the right environment to achieve positive community outcomes."

The maximum CAAP funding is \$500.00 per year, per child.

Trail Users should:

Avoid using trails from dawn and dusk, and anytime that visibility is limited.

Wear "hunter orange" (hat, vest, scarf, etc.). Put "hunter orange" on your pets as well. Avoid beige, brown, white, or green clothing.

Keep pets on a leash.

Hunters should:

Avoid hunting along trails and in areas with active trail use.

Be aware that you may be sharing the forest with other hunters and trail users.

Hunters must never shoot unless they are absolutely sure of their target and what is beyond it.

Be familiar with rules and bylaws for hunting in County forests.

New Paisley Bridge to Open with Ribbon Cutting on Friday, November 3

Bruce County and the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie are excited to invite the public to attend a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Friday, November 3 at 2:00 PM to celebrate the grand opening of the new Paisley Bridge. A short ceremony will take place on the north side of the Paisley Bridge, followed by a procession across the bridge.

Bruce County and the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie are excited to invite the public to attend a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Friday, November 3 at 2:00 PM to celebrate the grand opening of the new Paisley Bridge. A short ceremony will take place on the north side of the Paisley Bridge, followed by a procession across the bridge. The bridge will officially open to traffic and pedestrians shortly thereafter. Following the bridge opening, a celebration will take place at the Paisley Legion (event details on the <u>Arran-Elderslie Facebook Page</u>). Event attendees are also encouraged stay after the ceremony to enjoy the new sidewalks, and everything local businesses have to offer.

The Paisley Bridge replacement project, on Bruce Road 3, began in May 2022 and has successfully progressed on budget. The new bridge allows for more river flow clearance and will have a service life of 75 years. The Municipality of Arran-Elderslie will have also completed road, sidewalk, water, and sanitary construction on Queen Street, north of the new Paisley Bridge, by the November 3 reopening.

Bruce County Warden Chris Peabody highlights, "With great excitement, we are pleased to announce the grand opening of the Paisley Bridge on November 3. Bruce County successfully collaborates with our municipal partners to provide necessary infrastructure enhancements to support shared industries and our growing economy. The new Paisley Bridge on Bruce Road 3 will provide improved safety, services, and accessibility for the public long into the future."

Arran-Elderslie Mayor Steve Hammell adds, "Arran-Elderslie is a municipality rooted in collaboration. Our community consistently cooperates to produce celebrated fall fairs and other flagship events throughout the year. This bridge represents another core collaboration between the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie and the County of Bruce. We are grateful for the County's leadership in this project. Infrastructure enhancements like the new Paisley bridge and the Queen Street upgrades, will have long-term benefits for our residents, industries, and visitors. Please join us in the beautiful village of Paisley to explore the new Bridge and our fantastic downtown, as we get back to business."

While the bridge and roadwork will be substantially completed by November 3, 2023, the top lift paving will occur in the summer of 2024. There may be daytime temporary closures to facilitate some final restoration work into November while the temporary bridge and detour are

still available for use. The temporary bridge, which successfully served as an in-town detour for motorists and pedestrians, will be removed later in November 2023.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we finalize this important infrastructure work in Bruce County. Motorists can continue to drive to and through Paisley while bridge construction is being completed. Paisley businesses are open.

Semi-trucks, tractor trailers, and agricultural equipment are asked to continue following the identified Alternate Truck Routes until the Paisley Bridge has officially opened. View
