Noise

A complaint was received regarding occupants of a property in a residential area revving multiple vehicle engines. This was reportedly being done at night for three consecutive days. A notice has been sent to the property owner and occupant. It was advised that for future night occurrences the Ontario Provincial Police can be of assistance by calling their non-emergency number at 1-888-310-1122.

Zoning Infraction

One residential/agricultural property this month received a notice of violation for utilizing a trailer for habitation. The property has since been re-inspected and currently meets compliance.

Animal Control

One incident regarding two dogs running at large was addressed. One dog was registered and wore a Huron-Kinloss dog tag, which assisted in the prompt return to its owner. The other dog was later reunited with its owner.

There was one occurrence reported of a dog biting another dog. The bitten dog sustained injuries and was taken to a veterinarian for medical care. Later it was sent home to recover from those injuries. The dog that did the biting is now designated as a "dangerous dog". The designation permits specific restrictions placed on it to deter further occurrences.

Clean and Clear Yards

Two notices were delivered to residents for the removal of diseased ash trees on their properties. Compliance will be monitored.

An occupant was asked to move indoor furniture that had been placed outdoors. The material was not suitable for the outside weather. It has since been removed.
