

Advocacy Update: 2023 Fall Economic Statement

On Thursday, November 2, Minister of Finance, Peter Bethlenfalvy, introduced the 2023 Fall Economic Outlook and Fiscal Review: Building a Strong Ontario Together, known as the fall economic statement. The Government focused on two themes: Building Ontario and Working for You.

While many of the commitments contained in the fall economic statement were previously announced, we are happy to see the Government make continued investments in infrastructure, including the Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund. While welcome, this funding is likely insufficient to support the water infrastructure needs to build the housing targets the Province has set. We look forward to hearing more about the proposal to launch the Ontario Infrastructure Bank,

as well as the details of the Building Faster Fund. As an Association, we continue to advocate for the expansion of funding sources that appropriately address the infrastructure gap. Unfortunately, we were disappointed to see that the fall economic statement does not contain an update on the government's commitment to make municipalities whole following its changes to development charges made through Bill 23.

Other highlights with particular relevance to the municipal sector include:

Building Ontario

- Launching the Ontario Infrastructure Bank, a new arms-length, board-governed agency responsible for attracting public-sector pension plans and other trusted institutional investors to participate in large-scale critical infrastructure projects, with proposed initial funding of \$3 billion.
- \$200 million over three years in a new **Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund**, for the repair, rehabilitation and expansion of a variety of municipal water infrastructure projects.
- \$185 billion over 10 years, including \$20.7 billion in 2023–24, toward **Ontario's Plan to Build**, the Province's capital plan, to build highways, roads, transit, hospitals, long-term care homes, schools, child care spaces, broadband and other critical infrastructure.
- Making progress towards creating 86,000 new, high-quality, affordable child care spaces by 2026.

Working for You

- Extending the current gas and fuel tax rate cuts through June 30, 2024.
- Encouraging construction of **new purpose-built rental housing** by taking steps to remove the full eight per cent provincial portion of the Ontario Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) on qualifying projects.
- Supporting **skills development and training**, with more than \$1 billion invested over three years in the Skilled Trades Strategy, as well as \$860 million in the Training Stream and \$224 million in the Capital Stream of the Skills Development Fund.
 - This includes \$32.4 million over the next three years to support up to 6,500 paid research internships for undergraduate and graduate students, and postdoctoral fellows through Mitacs.
- Investing \$25 million over three years in the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program
 through the 2023 Budget, expanding the Ontario Bridge Training program with a \$3
 million investment in 2023–24 to help skilled newcomers start working in their trained fields
 faster, and removing Canadian work experience requirements for certain regulated
 professions to make it easier for newcomers to work in the professions they trained for.
- Building at least 1.5 million homes by 2031 through targeted incentives to municipalities, including the Building Faster Fund, strong mayor powers and the Streamline Development Approval Fund.

The Government is now projecting a \$5.6 billion deficit in 2023-24 based on updated economic and revenue information and higher contingencies to mitigate near-term risks. A deficit of \$5.3 billion is forecasted in 2024-25, followed by a surplus of \$0.5 billion in 2025-26.

We will continue to advocate for predictable long-term funding supports that are reflective of the value and cost of the services municipalities are expected to deliver. We will also continue to monitor and track your needs as members and municipal professionals when it comes to reducing the municipal reporting burden. If you haven't done so already, we encourage you to complete our intake form to provide your feedback on the most problematic reports - our goal is to use your real-life examples to help solidify and advance our advocacy efforts. We thank you in advance for providing your feedback and for your ongoing support.






