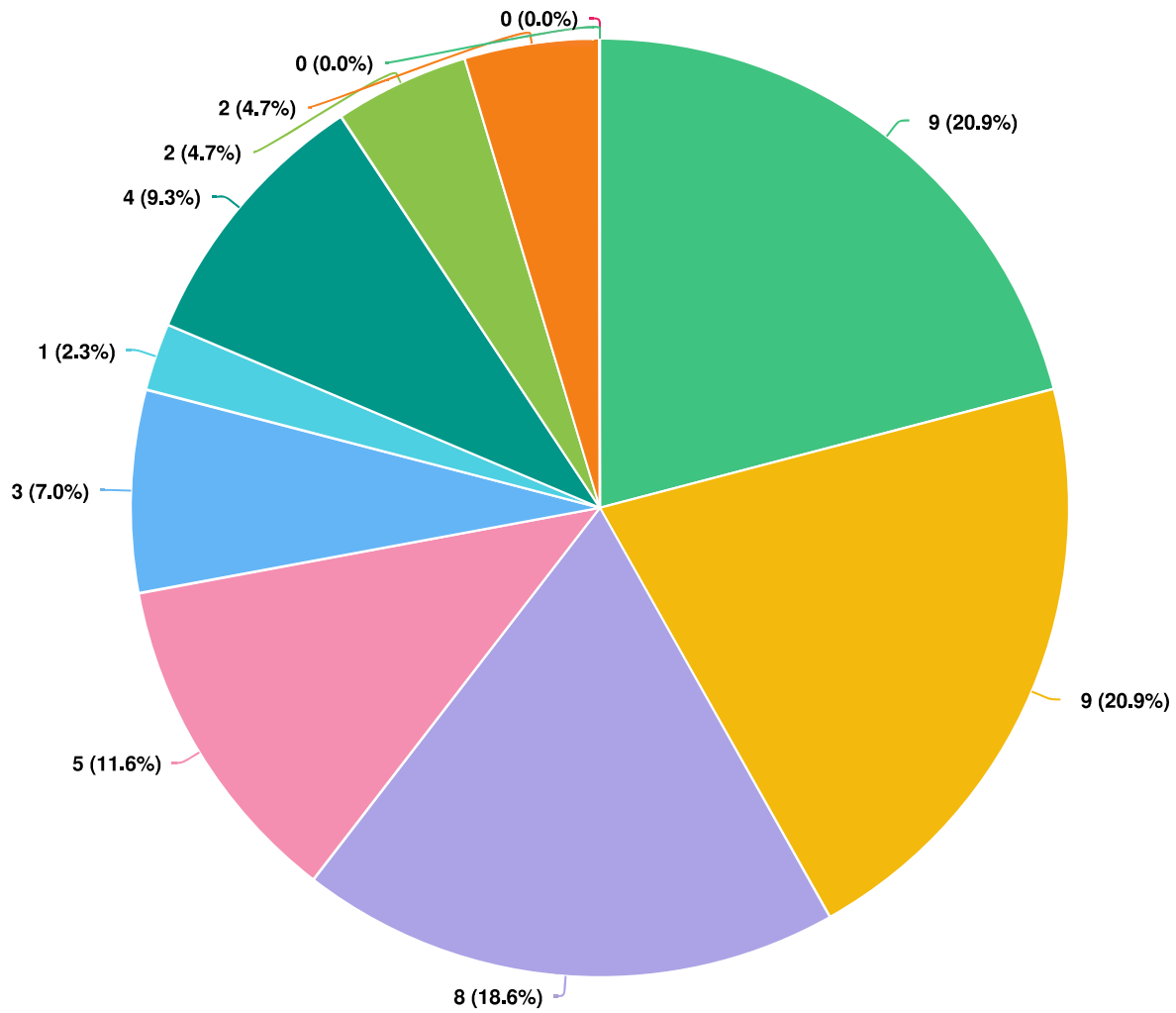

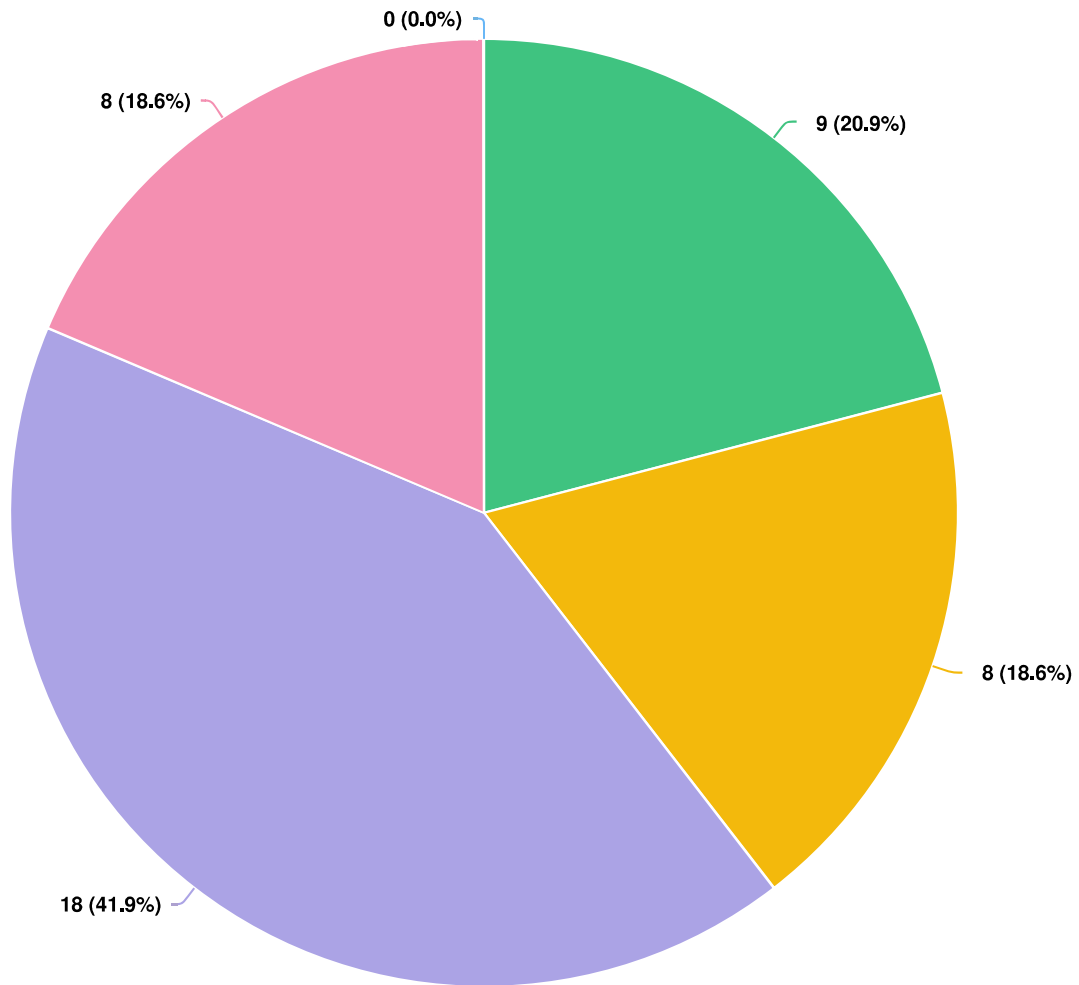

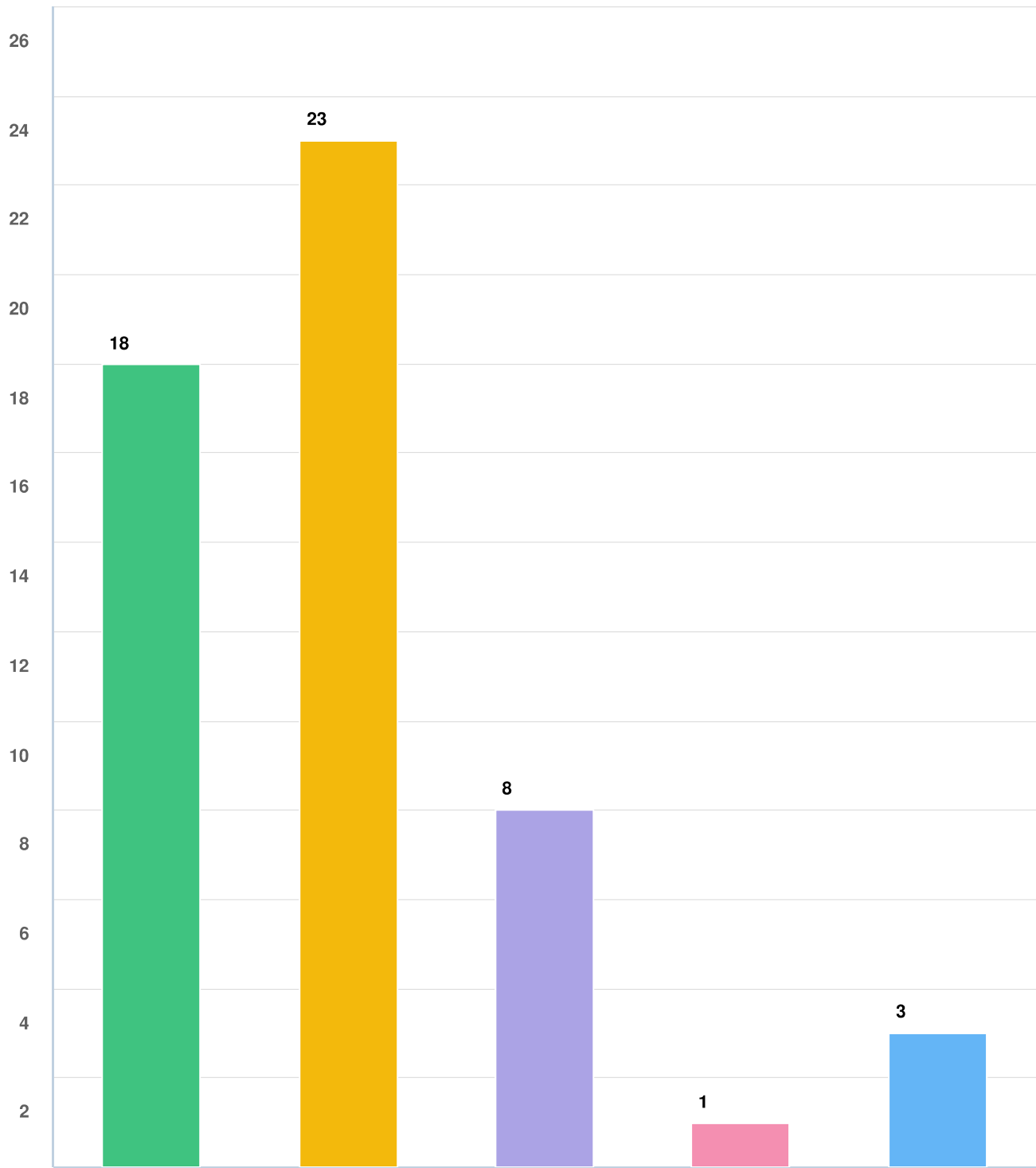

Q6 If any, what are the ages of your children in your household? (Check all that apply)

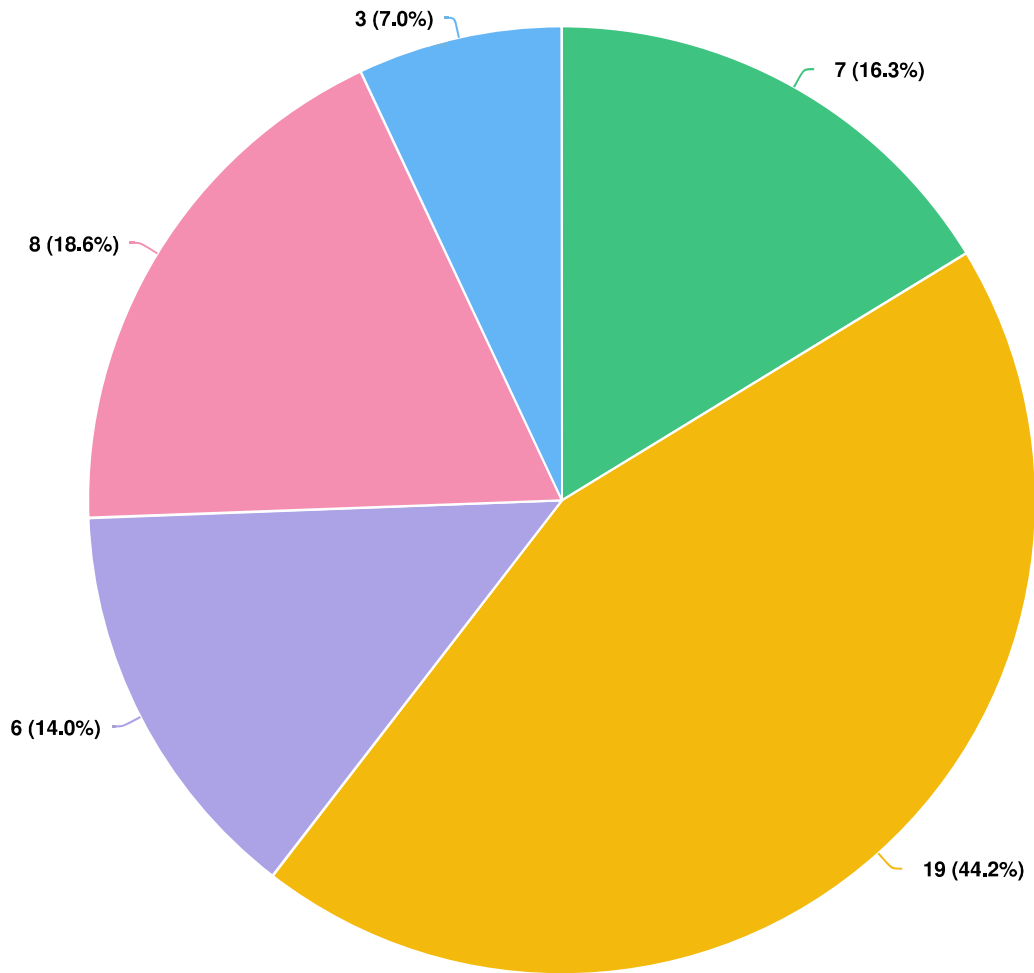

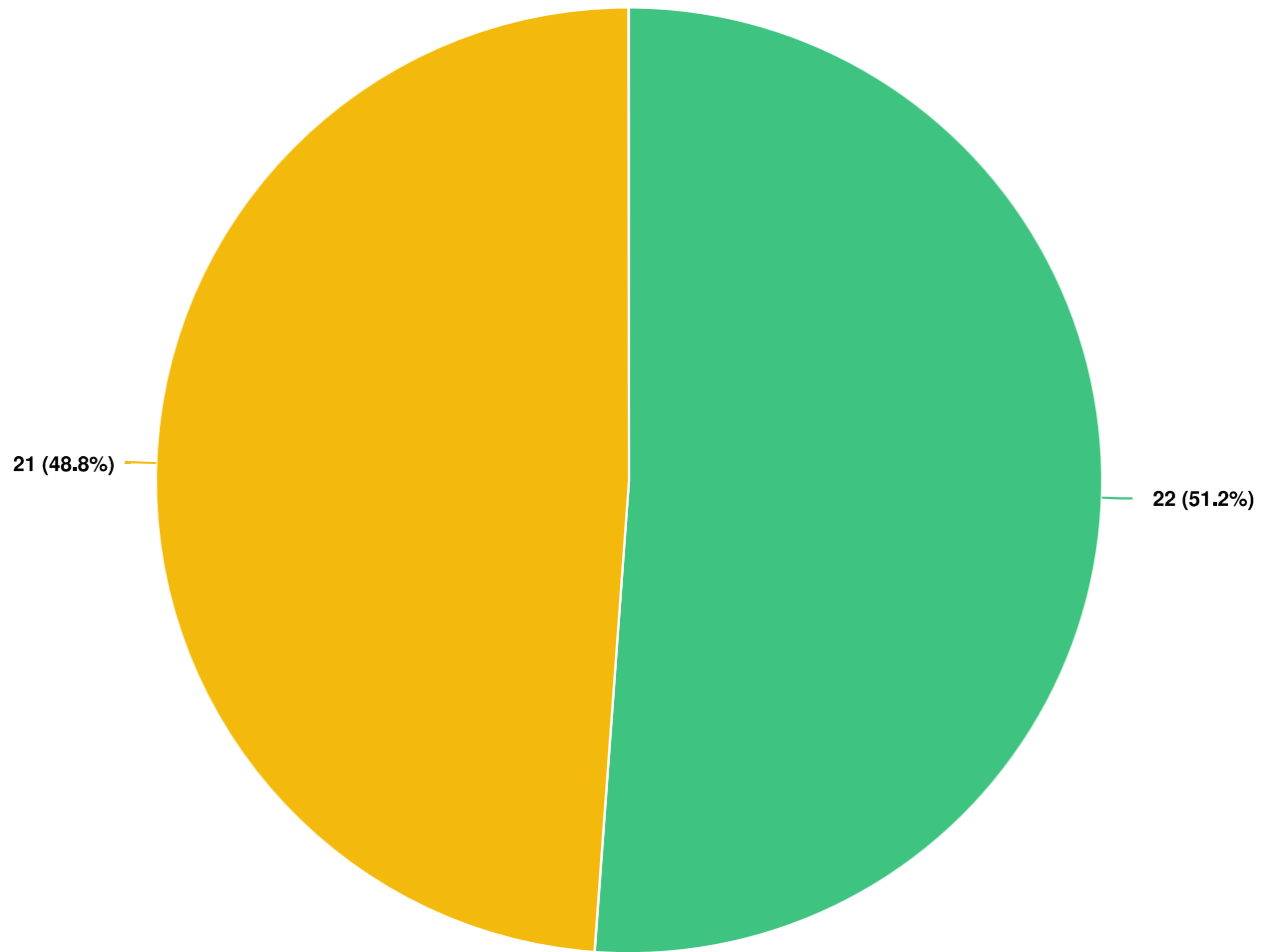

Q8 In general, do you come alone or with others?

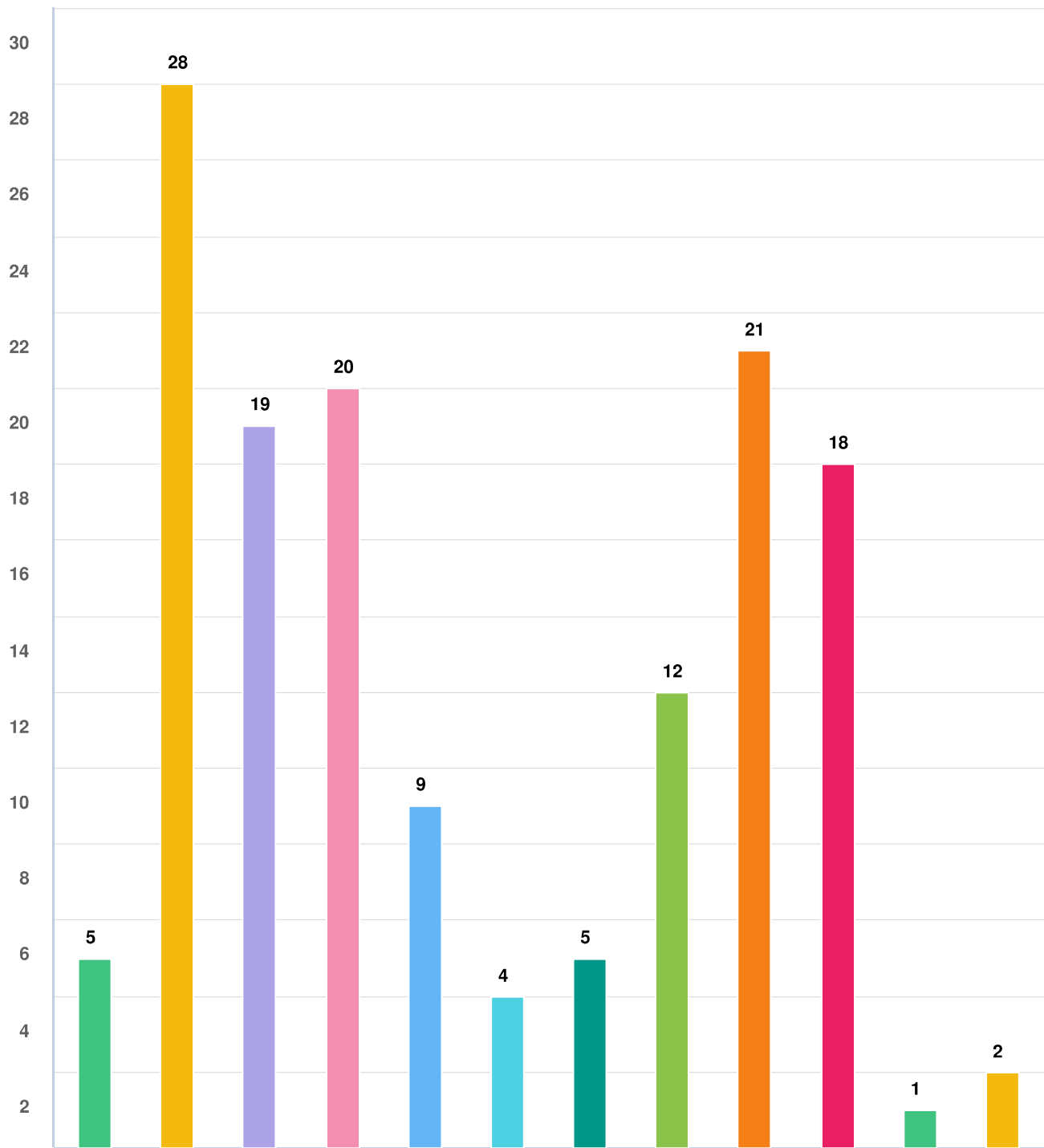

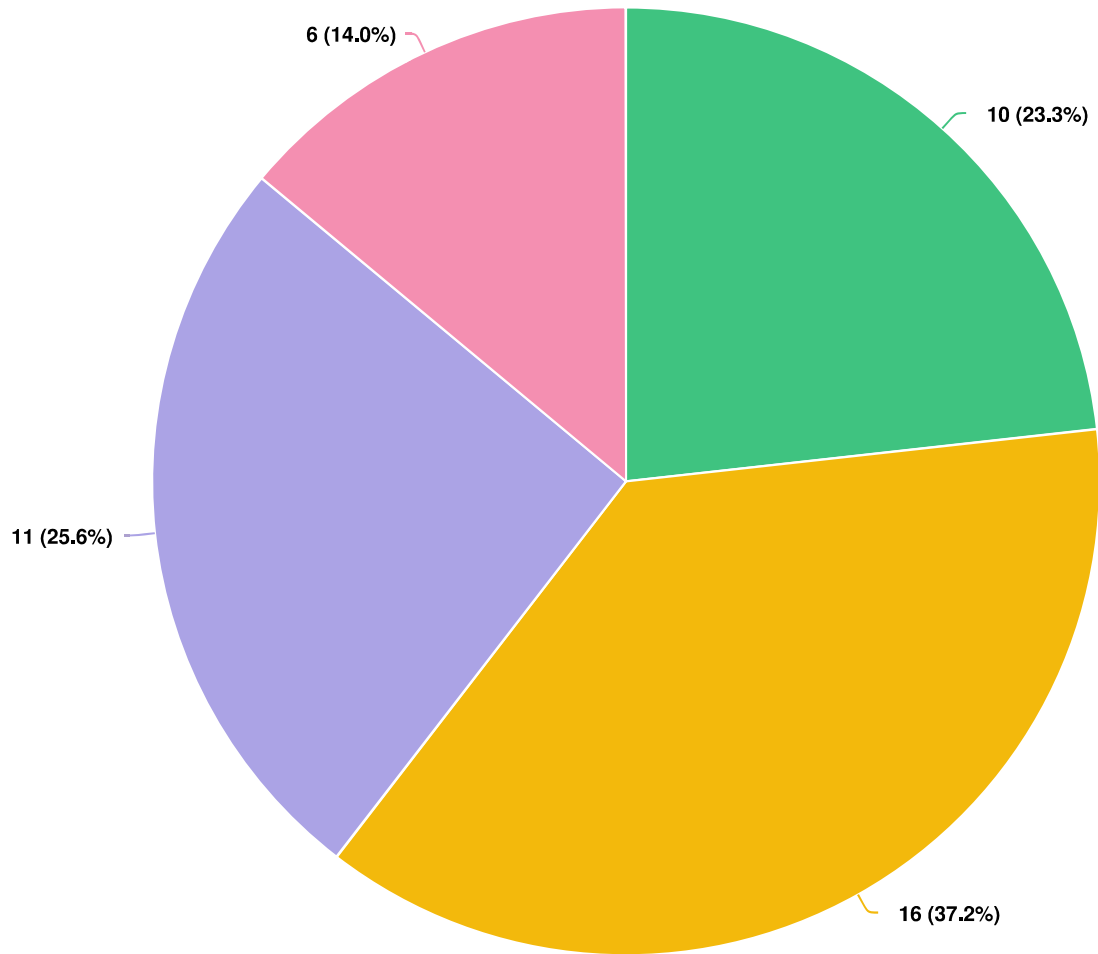

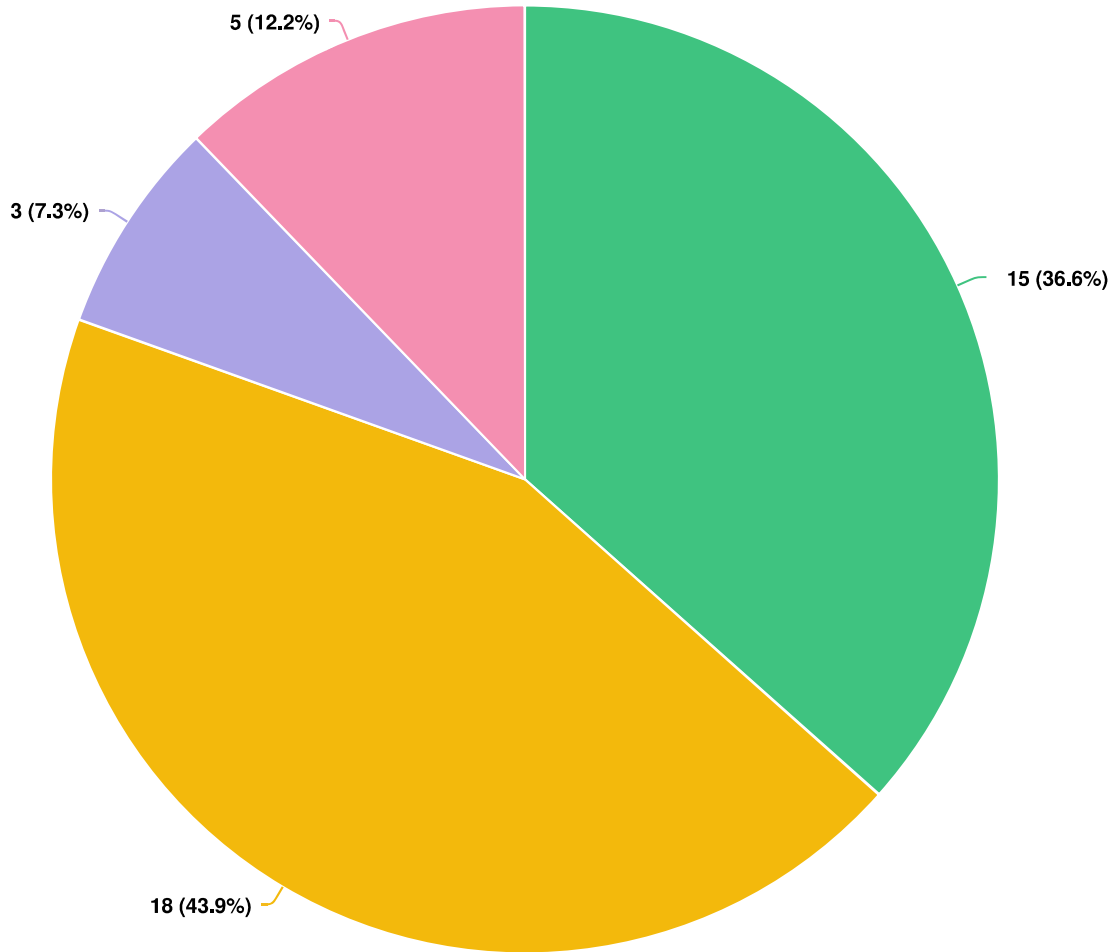

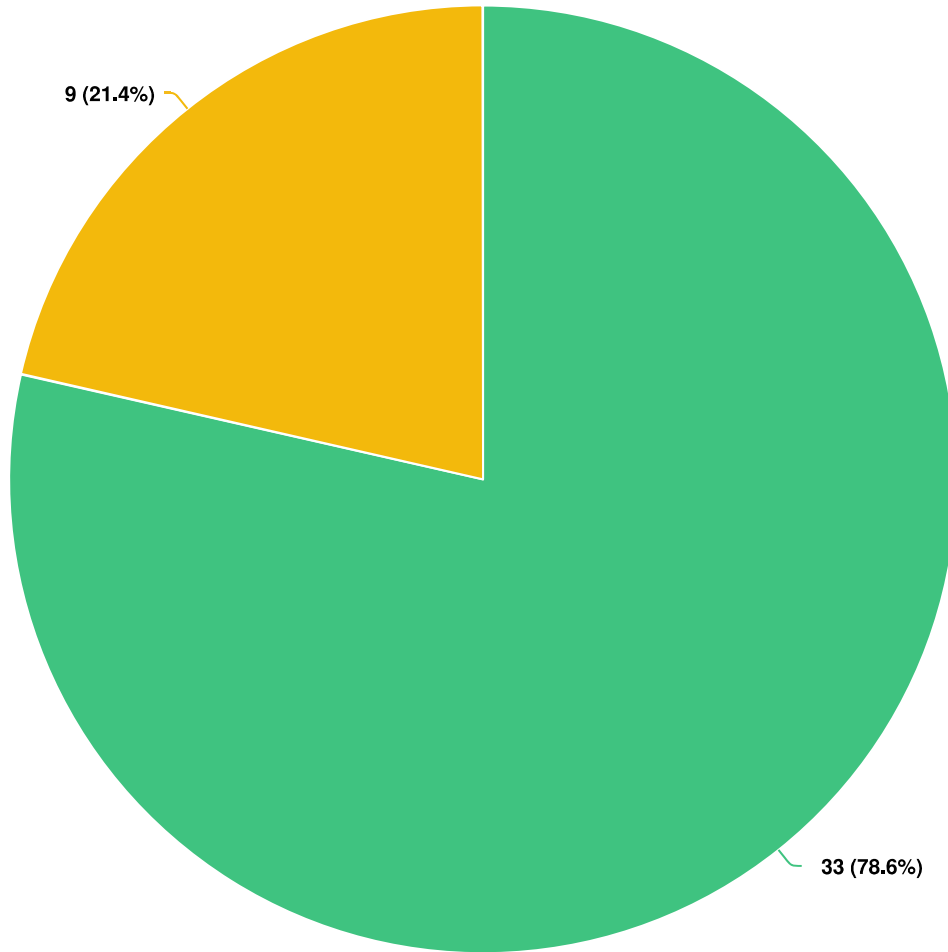

Q12 | Is there enough space in the park for your activities?

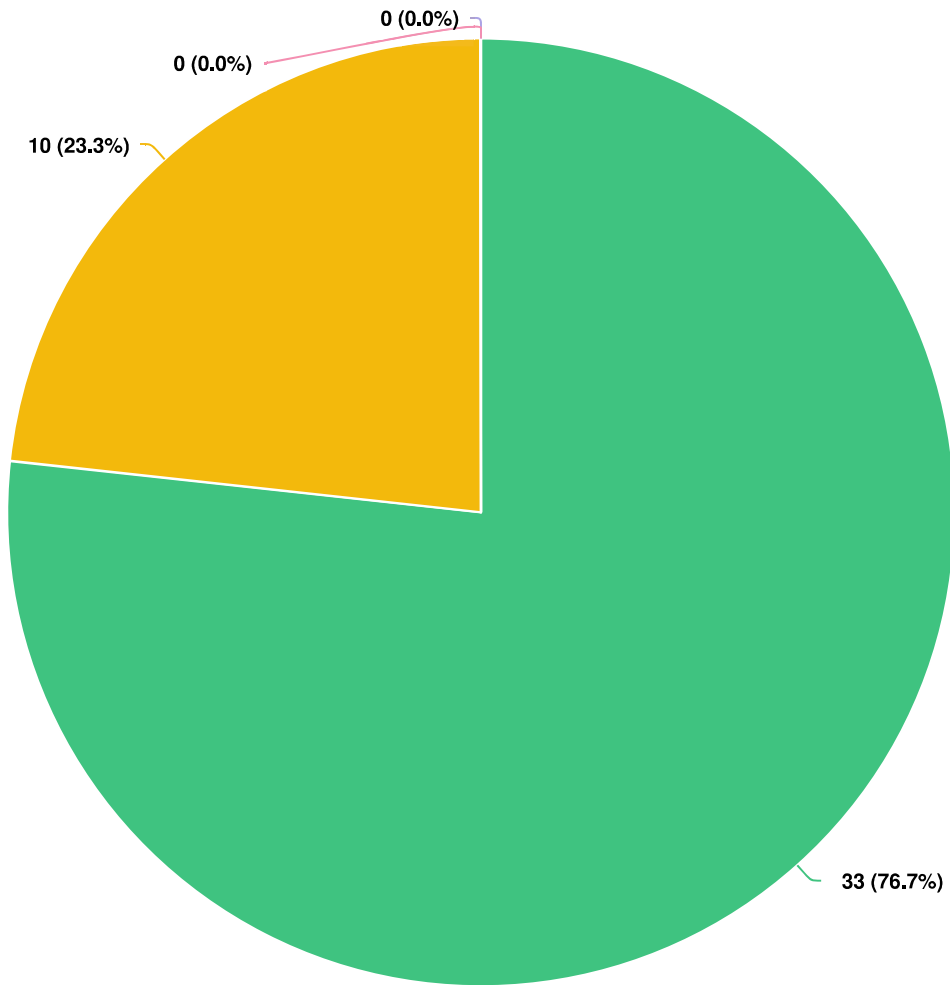

Q13 | Do you feel safe in this park?

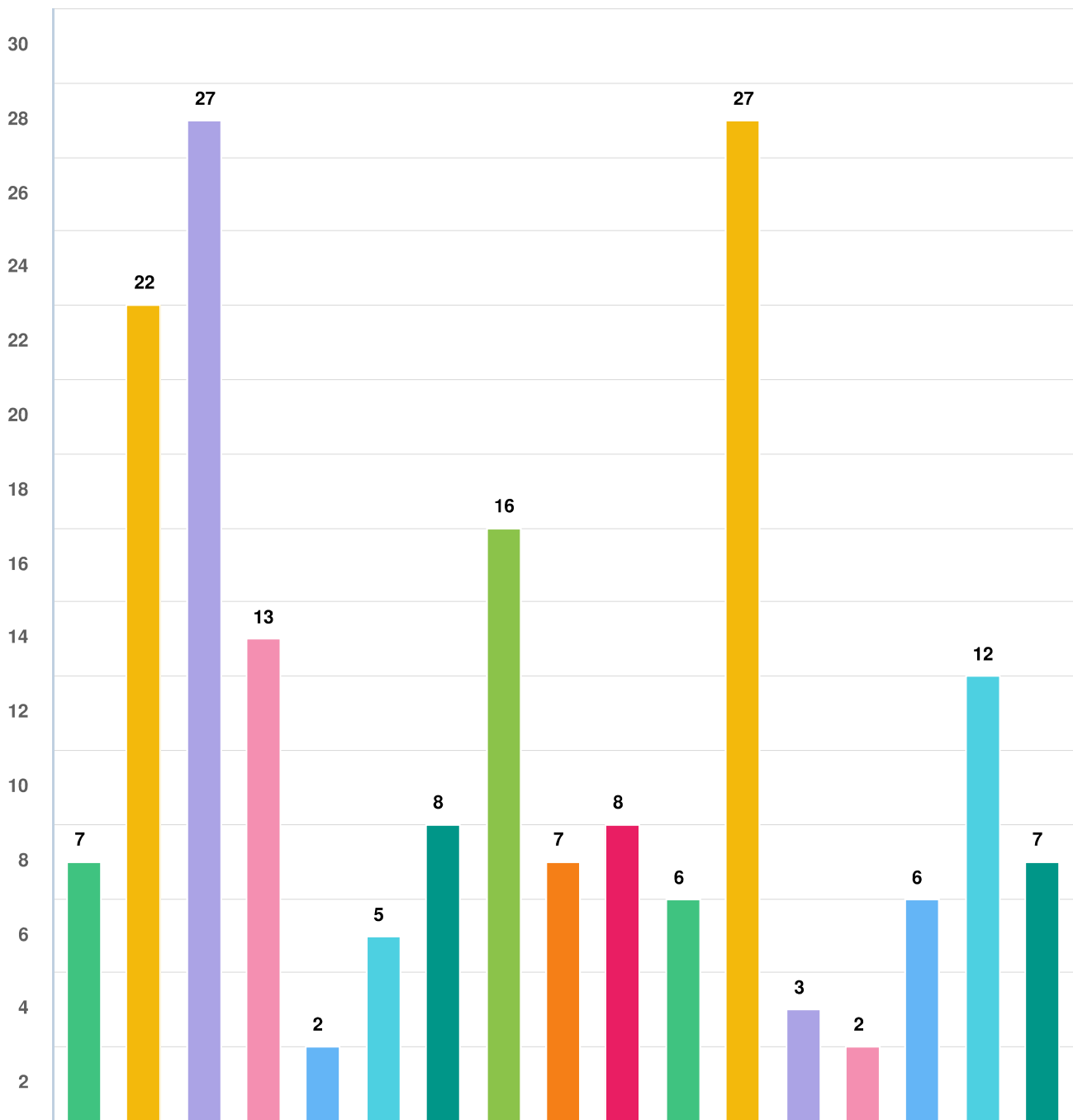

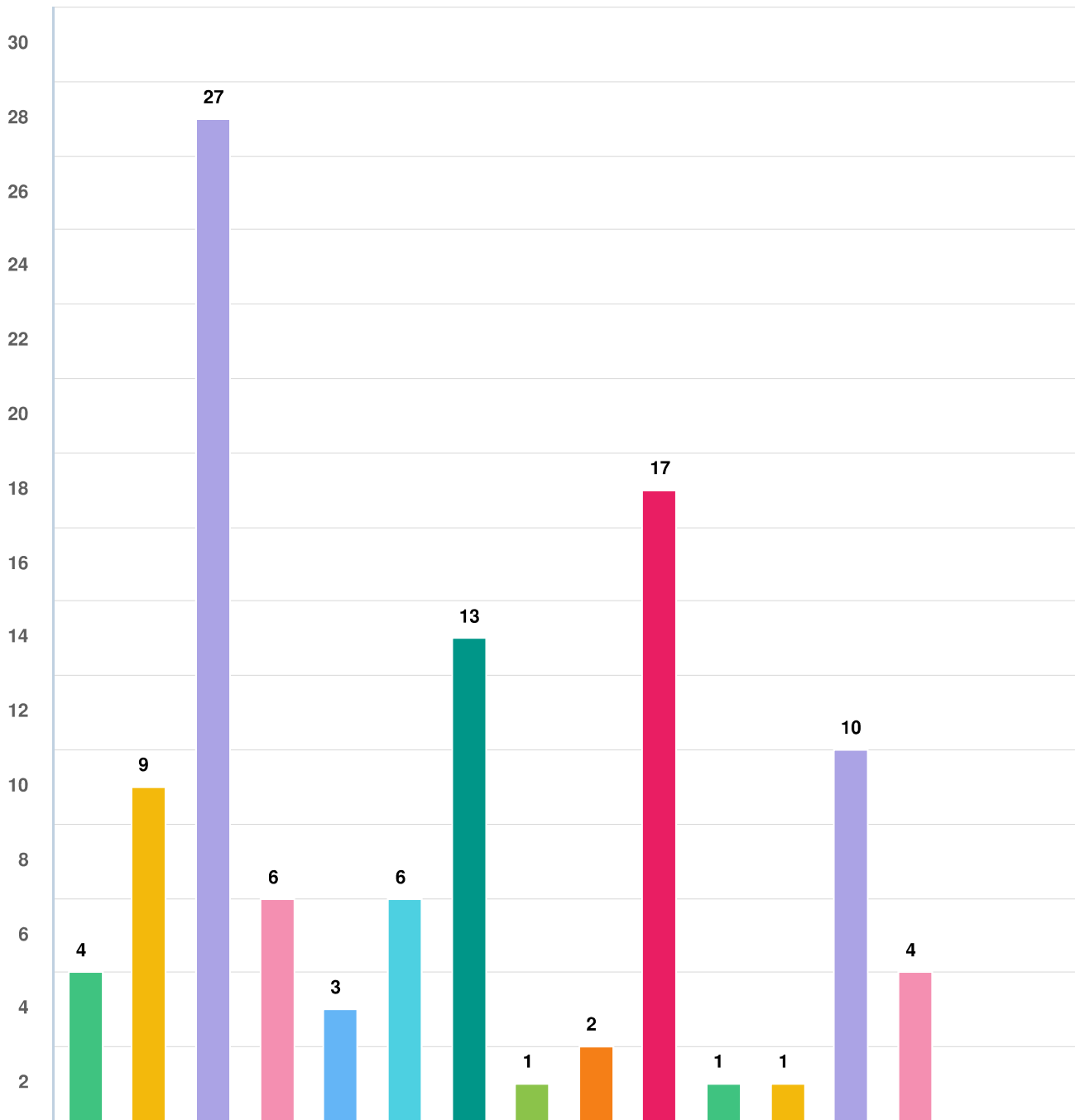

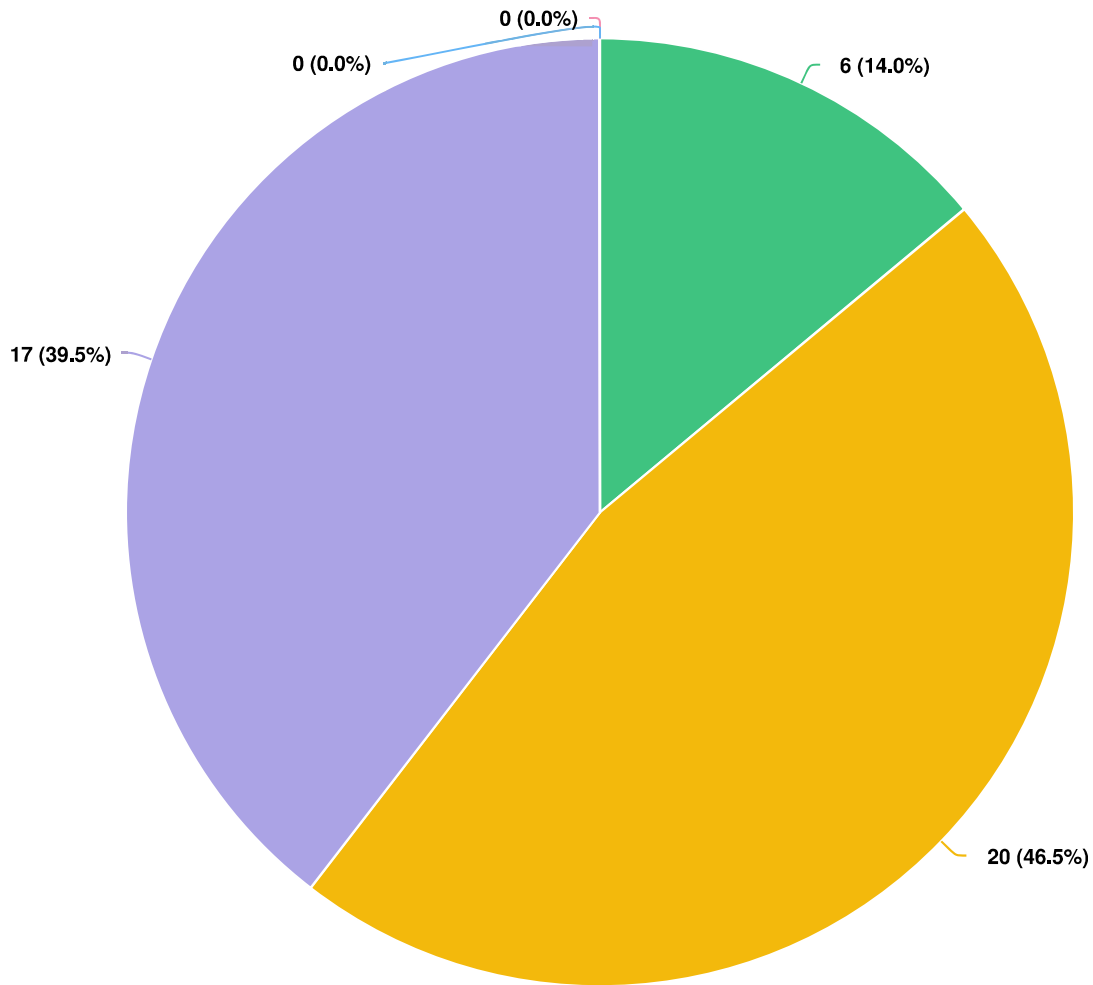

When we moved to this address 23 years ago, the park was very accessible for walking and using the playground equipment. Removal of ash trees several years ago, without removing tree stumps, has led to widespread overgrowth of ash bushes, reducing accessibility. This has been compounded by "dredging" of the drainage ditches this year which has eliminated easy access from our yard to the park. Also use of motor bikes, which are supposedly banned, contributes to excessive noise from the park. Our preference is to maintain the park as a green space for flora and fauna and walking. The restriction on motorized vehicles in the park needs to be enforces.

Please leave it as natural as possible, with as many intact trees as possible. Remove invasive species I've observed here. (ex. Lamium and Japanese Knotweed). Any work should proceed outside of bird-nesting and mammal breeding or migrating season i.e. not Spring, summer or early Fall. This park is habitat of the Eastern Whippoorwill, a threatened species in Ontario under Ontario Regulation 230/08 pursuant to the Endangered Species Act 2007 S.O. 2007, c. 6. Their population is threatened largely because of habitat loss. The park is also habitat for red-bellied woodpeckers, owls, bats, American Woodcock, many species of warblers, owls, wild turkeys and many other birds. The cedars are where the winter birds shelter during storms. It forms part of the age-old wildlife corridor running from Lake Range down to Lake Huron. I've personally seen deer, fox, coyotes, mallard ducks and wild turkeys, as well as the above-noted birds along the streambed. Pollinators are present where the grass is not mowed. The mental health, as well as physical, would be best served by leaving this park as natural as possible. McGregor Park has recently opened a "nature-bathing trail". Heritage park already has

this. No extra tax dollars need to be spent. Kids have less access to nature than they do to playgrounds. Most of them in this neighbourhood have fancy playgrounds in their own yards. The more trees we take down, the worse the flooding issues will become and the more erosion will occur. The more we leave this and other Huron-Kinloss parks natural, the less everyone has to pay in taxes and the better the future environment will be. Huron-Kinloss residents, visitors and other animal species will be. Heritage Park is a tiny but highly significant treasure - please have the foresight and wisdom to minimize it's destruction.
