New and Replacement Septic Systems


- ▶ 45 permits taken out in 2023
- ▶ 52 systems installed in 2023
 - ▶ 24 permits from 2022: 17 new systems, 7 replacements
 - ▶ 4 permits from 2021: 4 new
- 11 permits taken out for advanced treatment units in 2023
 - 4 installed in 2023
 - ▶ 10 from 2022 permits
 - ▶ 4 from 2021 permits

▶ 2022 – 69 permits issued, 66 systems installed, 1 cancelled

From the inspection data we know that age is the most common reason for systems needing replacement.


Permits for Replacement Systems

- Systems that assessed a 'high' risk rating are being replaced.
- Seeing replacement of old systems for new builds (tearing down the old building)

Timing of Replacements 2022 and 2023

- Many replacements are made when a system is due for an inspection
 - Most are High Age
 - Suggests owners suspect systems are failing and replace them because someone will be looking at it.
- Also seeing old systems replaced for new houses
- Systems also being replaced following inspections that identified problems.

Would these replacements happen without inspections?





Where are systems being replaced?

- Roughly an even split between Point Clark and rural areas of the Township.
 - Not surprising from the inspections we know that many of the older systems are in Point Clark and the rural areas of the Township.

HKCSI - Year in Review Year 1 of Cycle 3



Target was 471 properties:

336 due in 2023 128 past due 8 WHPA



408 inspections completed (including 52 inspections for new properties/replacement systems)

Risk Assessments

High Risk Rating – includes Age (40+ years), environmental hazard or structural hazard

Medium Risk Rating – Age (25-40 years), minor repairs required (pumping required, baffle repair etc), and non-conforming systems

Low Risk – less than 25 years old

Staying in Contact

- ► 664 letters sent out
- Over 424 telephone calls made & emails sent
- 116 properties doorknocked
- 85% of properties due in 2023, were booked by the end of September
- 91% were booked by October

In 2023, we made over 1,050 attempts to connect with property owners between May and October



That's an average of 6.8 contacts per day.

4 WPHAs in Huron-Kinloss with septic systems: Blairs Grove, Murdoch Glen, Point Clark and Whitechurch



8 properties inspected in 2023 (including 2 overdue)



3 properties require inspection in 2024

Advanced Treatment Units (Tertiary Treatment)

- 91 Advanced Treatment Units in Huron-Kinloss (up from 79 in 2022)
 - 44 have submitted record of annual reports or contracts
 - ▶ 12 new tertiary systems installed in 2023
 - ▶ 18 have never submitted any records
 - ▶ 11 have become delinquent in submitting records
 - 6 properties have refused to sign contracts with provider or are unhappy with current provider & without contracts
- Properties owners are sent letters outlining the requirement under the Building Code to have a service contract in place and annual maintenance inspection. Letters are sent out annually in February asking for documentation confirming this requirement.



Why Include Advanced Treatment Systems in the HKCSI Program?

- Because these systems are installed where a higher level of treatment is required, it is important to make sure these systems are being maintained – including having a service contract in place and having annual maintenance inspections done.
- We reach out to these property owners every year
 (+ follow ups) and maintain a database of contracts
 and maintenance records
- More and more of these systems being installed in the Township – the entire Crimson Oak subdivision will have advanced treatment units.
- Finding that property owners do not understand the requirements associated with these systems (i.e. maintenance and service contracts).

Looking forward to Year 2 (Cycle 3)

420 inspections due in 2023

+ 66 past dues from 2015-2023

+ 3 WHPA inspections

489 inspections

Advanced Treatment Unit Follow-Up

- Develop a 'New Owner' guide for Advanced Treatment Units
 - Work with realtors/developers to ensure information is distributed when homes sell.
 - Distribute with permits
 - Stress importance of proper maintenance and annual inspections.
- Continue to follow-up with property owners who have not provided records and contracts.




