#### 6. Business Arising from the Minutes

### **6.1** Correspondence from Ministry of Health Re: Health Hazards Letter

Comments were received via email regarding the letter from Ms. Mekker, who had requested the MMEWG to draft a letter to the Minister of Health regarding Industrial Wind Turbines being deemed a health hazard.

- 1. The Health Protection and Promotion Act of Ontario does apply to complaints about wind turbine noise.
- 2. The wind turbine noise emissions could possibly be considered a health hazard as defined in the Health Protection and Promotion Act of Ontario
- 3. The local Medical Officer of Health does have a duty with respect to this potential health hazard
- 4. A local Medical Officer of Health has the power to issue an order if a health hazard is identified

Ms. Mekker was unable to attend the meeting and would like to contribute to the discussion at a future meeting.

The Members acknowledged receipt of the response and deferred further discussion until the next meeting.

#### 6.2 MMEWG Response to the IESO

The municipal approval requirements are not sufficient where BESS projects are in close proximity to other municipal boundaries. Currently, the municipal support and public meeting requirements are only required from the siting municipality.

An example is the Bruce Trail/Orchard Storage facility being proposed in the Municipality of Meaford, however, it is in close proximity to the borders of Owen Sound and Georgian Bluffs. The public meeting was held over 15 km away from the project site itself, in Bognor. Fire protection and emergency services to the proposed site are not provided by Meaford and are provided by an inter-township fire protection agreement that involves Georgian Bluffs. The connection to the grid for the project is in Owen Sound.

### 7.1 Jane Wilson - Wind Concerns Ontario (WCO) - Verbal Update on BESS Proposals

WCO published the BESS proposal list earlier this week and it received a large number of hits was received overnight. It has brought forward a number of comments and concerns regarding the community engagement process and municipal support requirements. There is a lack of information and Council is being asked to make decisions with no facts.

The Hydro One standards outlines a set of requirements that are required to be submitted to receive approval from Hydro One. It also includes setback requirements. It has now been formalized into a policy is published on the internet.

Item 8.2.3 - Specifically question 2 in the document regarding decommissioning responsibility. The documents states that decommissioning is likely to take place following the expiry of the LT1 Contracts and the IESO would have then assumed responsibility in the capacity of system operator and removal of the facility from IESO administered markets. The IESO has not developed standards for decommissioning and this responsibility would lie with the landowners in accordance with applicable law.

The BESS projects are progressing in the same manor as wind turbine projects did in the past with little information being provided to Council during the decision making process.

The fact that these projects are going ahead without the Office of the Fire Marshall providing any guidelines or best practices is concerning.

#### 10. New Business

# 10.1 Discussion regarding Bill Palmer's presentation to the Ontario Society of Professional Engineers - Challenges Facing the Electrical System

Bill Palmer has provided the Members with a link to his presentation prior to the meeting for review due to its length.

The presentation provided some background information and looked at the situation of what has happened with energy demand in Ontario. The government is projecting that the demand of the electrical system will double in the next 15 years.

There are currently 2,710 wind turbines in Ontario today, 2,306 of which are located in South Western Ontario. The Federal Government is proposing that effectively, 100,000 wind turbines are needed in Ontario. In reality, most of the ideal siting locations have been utilized already.

The Province proposes that the load needs to double and the Federal Government proposes all wind, solar and water generation.

The Chair thanked Mr. Palmer for the summary of his presentation.

#### 10.2 BESS Project Discussions

The Working Group discussed the various projects that are proposed as a result of the IESO RFP.

The Orchard Storage/Bruce Trail Storage proposed in the Municipality of Meaford, and on the border of Owen Sound, is a 100 MW project. The Grey Owl Storage proposal in the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie is a 400 MW project.

The following concerns were raised are as follows:

- Installation of BESS on prime farmland
- Once the Municipal Support has been provided, no clear course of retraction without legal implications
- The Provincial Policy Statement will not be finalized until the new year
- Property taxation revenues
