Household hazardous waste materials include: paints and stains, propane tanks, used oil, aerosols, batteries, antifreeze, oil filters, solvents, household cleaners, fluorescent lights, fertilizers, fuel, pharmaceuticals, fire extinguishers, pesticides, and pool chemicals. Seed Libraries Return to Bruce County Public Library

Following a wildly successful first year, Bruce County Public Library is excited for the return of its Seed Library program. Starting Tuesday, April 2, Seed Libraries will be available in nine Branches, as well as the Bookmobile. Last year, over 600 seed packages were distributed throughout Bruce County, meeting the library's goal of helping foster a culture of sustainable gardening.

After an overwhelming response, BCPL expanded the program with the addition of t Ripley Branch and Bookmobile locations, ensuring even more patrons could access the resources needed to create their gardens. The Seed Libraries depend on sponsorships and seed donations to run, and having multiple seed sources has led to a diverse range of seeds available, from herbs to fruits and vegetables and various flowers.

Seed Libraries are growing across Canada and play an important role in promoting sustainable growing practices. By providing free seeds, BCPL supports cultivating a collection of seeds locally adapted to the region which helps preserve local Bruce County strains of plants and provides seeds that are resilient to our weather, soil, and local pests.

Seed Libraries are free to use with your BCPL card. Getting a card is easy, and there is no charge. You can visit your local Branch to register or sign up online at <u>getacard.brucecounty.on.ca</u>. Donating back to the Seed Library is not a requirement, but there are labelled envelopes for patrons to return harvested seeds.

New to gardening? BCPL also offers a large array of gardening resources within the system. Additionally, their <u>YouTube channel</u> hosts a collection of informative gardeni videos which include interviews, and tips and tricks to help teach and inspire.

Safety Reminders For Solar Eclipse on Monday, April 8

Did you know that it is not safe to view the eclipse without proper eye protection? Health impacts may include retinal burns, blurred vision, and loss of eyesight (immediate or delayed onset).



March 27, 2024

On Monday, April 8, 2024, southern Ontario will experience a total solar eclipse. A total solar eclipse is a rare celestial event where the moon passes between Earth and the Sun, casting a shadow on the Earth's surface. This moving shadow, called "the path of totality", will pass over many municipalities in Ontario. Although not in the path of totality, Bruce County will still experience a partial eclipse of approximately 95%.

Did you know that it is not safe to view the eclipse without proper eye protection? Health impacts may include retinal burns, blurred vision, and loss of eyesight (immediate or delayed onset). Bruce County Emergency Management would like residents to enjoy the eclipse safely. Here are some tips on how to view the eclipse in a safe manner:

Wear approved eye protection - Glasses with specialized filters adhering to the ISO 12312-2 international standard can be worn to prevent eye damage.

Glasses should be inspected for wrinkles or scratches ahead of use and should not be used if damaged.

Ensure that eclipse glasses fully cover your field of vision.

Put on glasses when looking away from the Sun, then look at the eclipse. Look away from the Sun before taking glasses off. Children should always be supervised during eclipses as they may not fully comprehend the risks involved.

DO NOT:

Use regular sunglasses to look at the eclipse.

View the eclipse through a camera/phone lens, telescope, binoculars or any other optical device.

If appropriate eye protection is not available, alternate viewing strategies should be considered, such as a live stream at <u>www.timeanddate.com/live/eclipse-solar-2024-april-8</u>.

Locally, <u>Bruce County Public Library</u> will be hosting live streams of the eclipse at both their Port Elgin and Chesley branches.

Bruce County encouraged by Ontario's 2024 Budget

The budget acknowledges the fiscal and service delivery pressures faced by Ontario's municipalities and has committed to avoiding further downloading of provincial pressures to municipal governments.



March 28, 2024

Bruce County is encouraged by the provincial budget tabled yesterday by Finance Minister Bethlenfalvy. The budget acknowledges the fiscal and service delivery pressures faced by Ontario's municipalities and has committed to avoiding further downloading of provincial pressures to municipal governments.

Bruce County is pleased to see the continued commitment to leading in nuclear energy through investment in Bruce Power. Bruce Power contributes to local prosperity, and the County looks forward to continued partnership with them to strengthen the local economy, by setting the conditions for success through the pre-development work for Bruce C.

The Budget also recommits to funding that supports the development of affordable and attainable housing, and associated infrastructure. The province has committed to new taxation tools for municipalities to maintain and create affordable housing. The province also announced the Ontario Transit Investment Fund that will focus on transit in rural areas. Overall, the budget commits over \$1 billion to support building homes across the province.

The Budget commits to continue the investment in mental health and addictions services with \$396 million-dollar in new funding province-wide. And the province has recently announced health investments in Bruce County ensuring better access to primary care.

"Our local Members of Provincial Parliament, Minster Thompson and Parliamentary Assistant Byers, have always been more than open to our feedback and have been advocates for the needs of Bruce County and our area municipalities," said Warden Chris Peabody. "We look forward to continuing the discussion with them as the 2024 budget is implemented, ensuring these significant investments benefit the citizens of Bruce County."

While the budget is encouraging, there is still much work needed to support municipalities with current fiscal pressures and economic conditions. The Association of Municipalities of Ontario is calling on the province to lead an Economic and Social Prosperity Review to ensure the long-term fiscal sustainability of the province's municipalities. Bruce County believes these conversations will provide a constructive space to collaborate and understand the pressures facing both the province and municipalities.

Owners Karishma and Rohan Kittur were joined by representatives from Bruce County and Saugeen Shores for a grand opening celebration that included a ribbon cutting and tour of the new learning centre on Tuesday, April 2, 2024.

The Little Cubs Learning Centre, conveniently located at 281 Goderich Street in Port Elgin, adds 106 licensed toddler, preschool, junior kindergarten and senior kindergarten child care spaces.

A Public Information Meeting is being organized by the County to update residents on the current status of the project. The meeting will provide details related to the proposed bridge reinforcement/rehabilitation work, including construction details, timing and traffic restrictions during construction. A Class EA update will also be provided, including a timeline for completion of the EA and finalization of the Class EA process.

THE PROJECT

The County of Bruce initiated a Class Environmental Assessment process in 2021 to address deficiencies present in the Durham Street Bridge which spans the Saugeen River along Bruce Road 4 in the community of Walkerton, Ontario (as shown on the accompanying key plan). Recent evaluations of the structure have clarified the extent of deterioration present within the structure. Based upon this new information, the County is considering reinforcement/rehabilitation of the crossing to address the deficiencies, rather than replacement. The work would be undertaken in 2024/25 with signalized lane restrictions that would allow a single lane of traffic to cross the bridge during completion of the repairs.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS:

The planning for this project is following the environmental planning and design process set out for Schedule 'C' activities under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) process, which is an approved process under the Environmental Assessment Act. The purpose of the Class EA process is to identify any potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed works and to plan for appropriate mitigation of any identified impacts. This process includes consultation with the general public, government review agencies, indigenous communities and affected property owners.

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT:

Following the May 1, 2024 meeting, input into this project will be accepted until May 19, 2024. Any comments collected in conjunction with this Class EA process will be maintained on file for use during the project and may be included in project documentation. With the exception of personal information, all comments will become part of the public record.

Whether hiking, biking, or riding an ATV, practicing proper trail etiquette is key to preserving our natural landscapes and fostering a welcoming outdoor community.

Trail etiquette encompasses a set of guidelines designed to promote safety, respect, and environmental stewardship, while enjoying outdoor trails. By following these guidelines, individuals can contribute to the sustainability and enjoyment of our outdoor spaces.

1. Stay on Designated Trails: Avoid venturing off designated paths to protect sensitive ecosystems and prevent erosion. 2. Yield Appropriately: Motorized users and cyclists should yield to pedestrians, and all trail users should yield to horses.

- 3. Share the Trail: Be courteous and respectful towards other trail users, including those with different modes of transportation.
- 4. Keep Trails Clean: Pack out what you bring in. Leave no trace behind.
- 5. Respect Wildlife: Observe animals from a distance and avoid disturbing their natural behaviors.
- 6. Legal Compliance: Many County trails have specific rules and regulations that must be followed such as the use of permits for motorized trails and using trails for their permitted uses only. Adhering to these rules helps maintain public access to County lands.
- 7. Control Pets: Keep dogs on a leash and clean up after them. Respect trail rules regarding pets.
- 8. Be mindful of trail conditions: If a trail is too wet or muddy, save your activity for another day.

Please also be advised that all motorized trails on Bruce County lands are currently closed for essential maintenance and improvements. We kindly request that you refrain from accessing these trails until they have undergone the necessary maintenance and are officially reopened for public use. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated as we work to ensure the safety and quality of our trail system. Thank you for your understanding and patience during this period.

2nd Annual Bruce County Housing Forum Brings Municipal and County Representatives Together to Discuss Housing Actions

On April 11, 2024, municipal leaders, including local elected officials and municipal and county staff, came together for the 2nd Annual Bruce County Housing Forum to discuss the need, supply, and affordability of housing in Bruce County.

On April 11, 2024, municipal leaders, including local elected officials and municipal and county staff, came together for the 2nd Annual Bruce County Housing Forum to discuss the need, supply, and affordability of housing in Bruce County. This event brought together representatives from each of the eight municipalities across Bruce County.

Warden Chris Peabody and CAO Christine MacDonald welcomed the attendees to the event and spoke about the newly developed Community Development Office.

"We have created the Community Development Office to provide leadership on key strategic priorities in Bruce County, including the supply and affordability of housing. Claire Dodds, our Commissioner of Community Development, leads a team of County staff across several Departments who work together to undertake this important work," says Chris Peabody, Warden of Bruce County.

Claire Dodds introduced the housing cross-functional team, made up of staff from Human Services, Planning, Economic Development, and Government Relations, who work together to research and identify actions the County can take on housing. "Having a good understanding of the data on affordability and housing needs across Bruce County helps inform the priority actions the County can lead on housing," says Claire Dodds, Commissioner of Community Development.

Actions taken by the housing team over the past year were highlighted, including completing a housing needs assessment, affordable housing toolkit, home share study, and updating zoning to permit additional residential units.

Attendees were inspired by guest speakers, Emma Cubitt, an architect at INVIZIJ in Hamilton, and Graham Cubitt of Indwell and Flourish. Flourish is a consulting company that helps clients advance affordable housing across Ontario. Both speakers shared their passion and experience creating innovative affordable housing solutions across rural and urban communities across Southern Ontario.

Throughout the day, there was a theme of collaboration, including the importance of County and municipal staff working together on housing solutions. There was also recognition of the need for other levels of government to invest in infrastructure and affordable housing builds, as well as make tools available to help the County and municipalities deliver affordable housing.

The day ended with an opportunity for attendees to share ideas, collaborate, and provide feedback on actions to increase the supply of housing and impact its affordability in Bruce County. This information will be considered as County staff work to develop a Housing Action Plan that will guide actions the County will lead between 2024 to 2026 on housing.

Background: It is broadly accepted that housing is affordable when a household is not spending more than 30% of its income on housing costs. The province has also defined affordable housing thresholds for households of low and moderate income. For ownership housing, the affordable housing threshold is housing that is affordable to households with incomes at the 60th percentile. For renter households, the affordable housing threshold is 100% of average market rent as published by Canada Mortgage Housing Corporation (CMHC). In Bruce County, the affordable housing thresholds for 2022/2023 were rents below \$1,324 per month and ownership costs below \$399,100.

About Bruce County: Bruce County is an upper-tier municipality in Southwestern Ontario, Canada, made up of eight lower-tier municipalities and 73,396 residents.
