The Community Safety and Well-Being Planning Homelessness Response Steering Committee has been working diligently to ensure community members are safely housed. The committee is a partnership with Bruce County, Grey County, and community service providers to further develop approaches to addressing homelessness through a rural perspective. In January and February 2024, 33 households have been housed from the By-Names List across Bruce County and Grey County. Having local data to measure the impact of coordinated services continues to drive changes in service delivery approaches and provides partners with the information needed to continue planning for our communities.

What is the By-Name List (BNL)?

A By-Name List is a real-time list of all known people experiencing homelessness in your community. It includes a robust set of data points that support coordinated access and prioritization at a household level as well as an understanding of

homeless inflow and outflow at a system level.

As of February 2024, the combined Bruce-Grey BNL identified 170 households experiencing active homelessness. Of those, 126 individuals are experiencing chronic homelessness, meaning they have been without stable housing for more than 6 months.

Homelessness Response

The primary goal of homelessness response is to lower the number of households experiencing chronic homelessness by increasing access to tenancies and decreasing the number of households entering the system. To help reach this goal, both Grey and Bruce Counties offer 10% of vacant housing units to individuals or families on the active By-Name List.

In addition, both Grey County and Bruce County offer Emergency Shelter and/or Short-Term Housing programs. These programs support as many households as possible with time limited shelter when experiencing homelessness. Community members can call 211 for the most up to date information about these programs, including information on how to access support.

The Homelessness Response team in Bruce and Grey is working hard to prioritize services and provide the highest level of supports to the residents of the community.

The ongoing work of CSWBP is supported by an advisory committee representing over 74 partners from across Bruce and Grey who are working together to address crime prevention by investing in social development, prevention, and risk interventions. This upstream preventative model focuses on creating protective factors that make individuals less vulnerable to crime and victimization.

NOTICE: Roadway Line Painting Taking Place Between mid-May and mid-June

Please take notice that the Bruce County line painting contractor will be conducting line painting operations on County Roads for the 2024 season during the months of May and June. This notice is to inform drivers to obey all signage and warning signs to keep their vehicles clean and clear of all roadway paint. Bruce County assumes no responsibility for paint damage claims from motorists who cross wet paint lines.



April 29, 2024

Please take notice that the Bruce County line painting contractor will be conducting line painting operations on County Roads for the 2024 season during the months of May and June. This notice is to inform drivers to obey all signage and warning signs to keep their vehicles clean and clear of all roadway paint. Bruce County assumes no responsibility for paint damage claims from motorists who cross wet paint lines.

When does line painting occur?

Line painting may be completed on County Roads in the mid-day, evening, or night-time hours when weather and conditions are appropriate.

Why don't line painters just paint at night?

The difficulty with painting at night arises when the temperature between the air and the road surface change at different rates. Condensation can occur on the roadway, making for poor conditions for paint to adhere to the roadway.

How long does it take for line paint to dry?

Dependent upon conditions, line paint can remain wet for up to 15 minutes.

Paint operations are causing traffic backups, can we pass the warning trucks?

The intent of the warning trucks behind the line painter is to provide enough space in between to allow for paint to dry. If you cross the centerline to pass line painting operations, chances are that your vehicle will end up with paint on it. Please be patient and follow the direction of the notification signage.

If I cannot remove paint from my vehicle, is the Municipality responsible?

Bruce County assumes no liability for paint damages to vehicles that have crossed wet paint lines or disobeyed the warning signs and warning vehicles.

The following pesticides will be used which are registered under the Pest Control Products Act (Canada):

Navius FLEX Herbicide (Reg. #30922) containing the active ingredients Metsulfuron – methyl and Aminocyclopyrachlor. Hasten NT Ultra Spray Adjuvant (Reg. #31760) containing the active ingredients Methyl and ethyl oleate (esterified vegetable oil).

ClearView Herbicide (Reg. #29752) containing the active ingredients Aminopyralid (present as potassium salt), and Metsulfuron-methyl.

We are controlling Noxious weeds under Public Works Exception of the Cosmetic Pesticides Ban for the promotion of public health and safety.

Spraying will commence on May 13, 2024, weather permitting, and conclude June 30, 2024.

Residents are invited to attend Pre-Construction Information Session on Thursday, May 9, 2024 at the Mildmay-Carrick Recreation Complex (24 Vincent Street, Mildmay, ON). This Information Session will take place from 5:30 PM to 7:00 PM with brief presentations at 6:00 PM.

In 2024, Bruce County will be proceeding with Bruce Road 6E (Absalom St E) Rehabilitation from George St to Kleist St, along with the rehabilitation of the Meax Creek Bridge on Bruce Road 6E and the Fischer Bridge on Bruce Road 6.

Residents are invited to attend Pre-Construction Information Session on Thursday, May 9, 2024 at the Mildmay-Carrick Recreation Complex (24 Vincent Street, Mildmay, ON). This Information Session will take place from 5:30 PM to 7:00 PM with brief presentations at 6:00 PM.

Kurtis Smith Excavating Inc. was the successful contractor and will be completing the construction work for Bruce Road 6E (Absalom St E) Rehabilitation from George St to Kleist St, VanDriel Excavating Inc. was the successful contractor and will be

completing the construction work for the rehabilitation of the Meax Creek Bridge on Bruce Road 6E, and AJN Builders Inc. was the successful contractor and will be completing the construction work for the rehabilitation of the Fischer Bridge on Bruce Road 6E. B.M. Ross and Associates Limited (B.M. Ross) and BT Engineering Inc. (BTE) will administer the construction contract on behalf of Bruce County.

Construction Staging and Road Closures:

Bruce Road 6E (Absalom St E) Rehabilitation is tentatively scheduled for construction from May to October 2024. The work includes rehabilitation of storm and sanitary sewer, patching of sidewalk, rehabilitation of watermain, extension of concrete curb, and new asphalt paving. Adjacent residents will be notified in advance of impacts to their driveways. The rehabilitation of the Fischer Bridge will involve periods of full bridge closure and is tentatively scheduled for construction from July to September 2024. The rehabilitation of the Meax Creek Bridge will involve periods of full bridge closures and is tentatively scheduled for construction from July to September 2024.

During construction, Bruce Road 6 East (Absalom St E) will maintain one lane of traffic. The Meax Creek and Fischer bridges will be closed to through traffic. Local access and emergency services to properties will be maintained at all times from one direction. Signage will be installed indicating alternative routes.

Additional Information:

The County, B.M. Ross, BTE, AJN Builders Inc and Kurtis Smith Excavating Inc. will provide updates as the rehabilitation projects progress. There will be a brief presentation at the Pre-Construction Meeting to provide an overview of the projects. There will also be a series of exhibits at the meeting showing the planned construction works.

Residents of Bruce County are encouraged to remove hazardous waste materials from their homes, garages, and basements and dispose of them in an environmentally safe manner.

Household hazardous waste materials include: paints and stains, propane tanks, used oil, aerosols, batteries, antifreeze, oil filters, solvents, household cleaners, fluorescent lights, fertilizers, fuel, pharmaceuticals, fire extinguishers, pesticides, and pool chemicals. Please note that commercial waste, agricultural waste, industrial waste, PCB's, ammunitions, and flares will not be accepted. Only containers with a volume of 30 litres or less will be accepted. Waste must be received in containers that can be disposed of. Containers will not be emptied and returned (ie. gas cans). Empty metal paint cans are blue box recyclable.

Answers:

- 1. At least two litres of water are recommended per person per day. Be sure to include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order.
- 2. False One of the worst floods in Canada's history occurred in July 1996 in the Saguenay River Valley, in Quebec. Ten people died and 15,825 others were evacuated when flood waters swept through thousands of homes, businesses, roads, and bridges. The flood was caused by 36 straight hours of heavy rainfall, for a total accumulation of 290 mm (approximately to the knees). Estimated damages: \$1.5 billion.
- 3. True In June, most hail storms occur in southern Canada and the north central United States. Violent storms may deposit enough hail to completely cover the ground, damage crops, or block storm sewers. Up to 2% of the value of crops is destroyed by hail every year.
- 4. It is recommended that your emergency kit contains enough supplies to sustain you and all members of your family for at least three days (72 hours).
- 5. False Tornadoes occur most often in the spring and during the summer, but they may form any time of the year.
- 6. The Canadian Disaster Database contains references to all types of Canadian disasters, including those triggered by natural hazards, technological hazards, or conflict (not including war). The database describes where and when a disaster occurred, who was affected, and provides a rough estimate of the direct costs. Explore the <u>Canadian Disaster Database</u> and learn more about potential risks/hazards in your area.

Please take notice that Bruce County is holding a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event on Saturday, June 1, 2024 at the Bruce County Transportation Yard located at 94 Bruce Road 2, Walkerton, ON. The event will run from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Residents of Bruce County are encouraged to remove hazardous waste materials from their homes, garages, and basements and dispose of them in an environmentally safe manner.

Household hazardous waste materials include: paints and stains, propane tanks, used oil, aerosols, batteries, antifreeze, oil filters, solvents, household cleaners, fluorescent lights, fertilizers, fuel, pharmaceuticals, fire extinguishers, pesticides, and pool chemicals. The full list is available at <u>www.brucecounty.on.ca/hazardouswaste</u>.

Please note that commercial waste, agricultural waste, industrial waste, PCB's, ammunitions, and flares will not be accepted. Only containers with a volume of 30 litres or less will be accepted. Waste must be received in containers that can be disposed of. Containers will not be emptied and returned (ie. gas cans). Empty metal paint cans are blue box recyclable.

The Community Safety and Well-Being Planning (CSWBP) Action Table to address poverty and income disparities, led by the Bruce Grey Poverty Task Force, has been implementing solutions to address income challenges in our communities.

The CSWBP identified poverty and income as a priority for the communities of Bruce and Grey based on community feedback and local data. Community members provided feedback that they are concerned about their ability to pay bills, meet basic needs, and access financial support. Data shows that median household incomes in our region are lower than Ontario and approximately 20% of children are living in poverty.

With those concerns top of mind, the Bruce Grey Poverty Task Force has launched many programs to support community members with income stability. An example of this is the Bruce Grey Community Volunteer Network that supports the Volunteer Income Tax Program. In 2022 the program helped bring back over \$9,000,000 to 3,050 individuals across three counties through income benefits, tax credits and refunds.

The Bruce Grey Poverty Task Force is also engaging with people with lived experience and has focused on increasing awareness of income disparity, food security, and hunger in order to reduce stigma, advocate for policy change, and enhance collective impact.

What is the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan (CSWBP) Grey-Bruce?

Community Safety and Well Being Planning helps organizations improve the things that keep us healthy, happy, and safe. Together, we use research to create solutions focused on education, health care, food, housing, income, crime, and belonging. It is important that we create a welcoming community where problems are solved before they happen and where different professionals and community members come together to help people now and in the future.

The ongoing work of CSWBP is supported by an advisory committee representing over 74 partners from across Bruce and Grey who are working together to address crime prevention by investing in social development, prevention, and risk interventions. This upstream preventative model focuses on creating protective factors that make individuals less vulnerable to crime and victimization.
