Background: The Community Services Department operates and maintains various facilities, parks, and trails in the Township throughout the calendar year.

Discussion/Analysis/Overview:

Lakeshore

An abnormal amount of driftwood, logs and branches washed up along the shoreline, south of the Pine River Boat Club. The debris started at the boat club and spanned 0.5 km south. Elliot Construction was hired to gather and remove the large branches and logs. Staff generally do not remove driftwood and logs; however, this case was deemed to be a public safety issue.

Pollinator Gardens

Community Services staff are assisting the Ripley and District Horticultural Society with pollinator gardens at the Ripley Library and Blue Park. Staff in conjunction with the horticulture society have removed the existing shrubs at the library and have tilled the soil for the new garden at Blue Park. The gardens are expected to be completed in June.

<u>Lighthouse Garden</u>

Staff assisted the Point Clark Beach Association in installing a new garden at the Point Clark Lighthouse Museum. The old shrubs were removed, and new shrubs installed (picture attached). The beach association also cleaned up the lighthouse park gardens beds.

<u>Flags</u>

New flag poles were installed at the Point Clark Community Center and the memorial garden bed beside the Municipal Office. A1 Flags Inc completed the install which included a concrete base.
