#### **Animal Control**

There were 6 complaints received regarding dogs running at large with the Township.

One dog was a runaway from a local doggy daycare business. The dog was later found by the dog owners. The business is being investigated to see if a kennel licence is required for continued operation.

The other dog at large complaints were all situations that occurred on the public beach. Where owners could be identified, notices of violation were issued.

One of the dogs that was running at large on the beach attacked another dog that was leashed. The dog that was attached suffered minor injuries from being tangled with the other dog from the leash during the altercation and from being bitten. A notice was issued with other penalties pending on the complete findings of the investigation.

## **Property Maintenance**

A Property Standards Order was upheld during the Property Standards Appeal Hearing on August 14, 2024. The property owner was provided an extension of time to supply the Township with a structural engineer's report. The report will provide recommendations for the building in question and the schedule to remedy the property. #### **Beach Violations**

A complaint was filed regarding individuals cutting tree limbs of trees located along Boiler Beach Road. It was said that individuals were using it for wood for their beach fire. There was no individual identified. The situation will be monitored.

## **Golf Car Pilot Project**

There were four individuals who reached out to voice their concerns regarding golf cars being driven on roadways. The mentioned concerns and violations were:

- Minors being permitted to drive
- Golf cars being driven on the public beach
- Golf car being over overloaded with passengers in an unsafe manner

- Open alcohol being consumed while gold car is being driven, and
- Unsafe operation of golf cars by lack of road regulations being followed.

The recommendation was made to contact the Ontario Provincial Police to enforce the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. H.8. Additionally, it is encouraged for individuals to report incidents to the Township and provide evidence.

## **Zoning Infractions**

The Township has heard from residents with concerns about a fellow resident housing chickens in a residential area. After an inspection of the property, a notice of violation was issued to remove the chickens from the residential property. Chickens are not a domesticated animal/pet but are considered an agricultural animal by the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs, therefore they are only permitted on Agricultural Zoned properties.
