



This budget is an important step to realizing the vision set out in the 2023-2026 Bruce County Strategic Plan, our Indigenous Reconciliation Framework, and the implementation of other council endorsed initiatives that are foundational in realizing the strategic vision.

On Thursday, October 10, 2024, Bruce County Council received the draft 2025 Capital and Operating Budget. This budget is an important step to realizing the vision set out in the 2023-2026 Bruce County Strategic Plan, our Indigenous Reconciliation Framework, and the implementation of other council endorsed initiatives that are foundational in realizing the strategic vision.

The current municipal budget environment, across the province, presents challenges. The Federation of Canadian Municipalities show that only 8 cents of every tax dollar goes to municipalities, the rest going to the provincial and federal governments. However, municipalities are responsible for much of the infrastructure and services we use in our daily lives. The Association of Municipalities of Ontario has called for a renewed funding model for municipalities through their request for a Social and Economic Prosperity Review. Their initial work showed that municipalities are subsidizing areas of provincial

responsibility. In fact, Bruce County in 2022 provided over \$37 Million in additional funding for housing, health services, and social services, beyond the provincial funding for these programs.

While the pressures outlined above are real, the draft 2025 Budget keeps levy increase moderate while focusing on keys strategic initiatives, including:

Investing in healthcare and wellness across the County, including expanding the community paramedic program, investments in Brightshore's mental health centre, Community Safety and Wellbeing, and primary care recruitment ensuring Bruce County has access to quality services.

Funding for an Additional Residential Unit pilot program to address housing affordability across the County.

Implementation of the Bruce County Indigenous Reconciliation Framework, and Bruce County's Saugeen Anishnaabek Reconciliation Pathway and Action Plan acknowledging the Saugeen Ojibway Nation, as knowledge keepers in their traditional territory, and recognizes our unique government to government relationship with the Saugeen Ojibway Nation.

Develop services to support innovation and resiliency in Bruce County's Agriculture sector, including funding for the Agri-Food Innovation Grant and providing direct support to producers to access federal and provincial support programs.

Leading the creation of a Clean Energy Transition Cluster ensuring local business are supported to transition to clean sources of energy.

Implementation of Rural Homelessness Response program to reduce chronic homelessness across the County.

Development of an Age Friendly Community strategy recognized by the World Health Organization to ensure all are welcome in Bruce County.

Importantly, the draft 2025 Budget invests in the County's Asset Management Plan. This provides for a 2.5% investment in the maintenance of County infrastructure such as roads, bridges, paramedic stations, etc. This investment ensures the long-term sustainability of these assets.

This year's draft budget includes a 6.81% levy (tax) increase. This increase is made up of two parts:

4.04% for maintaining services. This amount is the investment needed to continue to deliver the services and infrastructure that exist today.

2.77% of the increase is for new initiatives or assets. This increase pays for the development of new services or assets that are outlined in our strategic plan.

Bruce County Council will conduct budget review, discussion, and direction into November with the potential for budget approval and adoption in December.

Warden Chris Peabody commented, "Council has worked diligently over the past two years to set the strategic direction for the County. We appreciate staff tabling a 2025 draft budget that aligns to that strategy. Council will discuss this budget over the coming weeks to deliver for Bruce County. Balancing investment in needed infrastructure and services, with fiscal reasonability."

Federal, provincial programs available to help seniors with cost of dental care

Grey Bruce Public Health and Bruce County are collaborating to raise awareness about the critical link between oral health and overall health as well as available government-funded programs to help eligible seniors cover the cost of dental care.

Grey Bruce Public Health and Bruce County are collaborating to raise awareness about the critical link between oral health and overall health as well as available government-funded programs to help eligible seniors cover the cost of dental care.

The <u>Canadian Dental Care Plan</u> (CDCP) and <u>Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program</u> (OSDCP) are both designed to assist seniors who face financial barriers to receiving routine and restorative dental services.

"Research continues to show that a healthy mouth is key to good overall health and well-being," says Jason Weppler, Manager of the Oral Health Program at Grey Bruce Public Health.

"Oral health problems, which are more prevalent in older adults, can negatively impact a person's quality of life — as they can cause pain, anxiety, and discomfort, and impact eating, sleep, and self-esteem. Evidence also shows connections between

oral diseases, which include tooth decay and gum disease, and other diseases in the body, such as Type 2 diabetes and diseases of the heart and lungs."

However, about 40% of seniors aged 65 and older and more than half of seniors over age 85, report not visiting an oral health professional in the previous 12 months. Just over one in 10 Canadians aged 60 to 79 has untreated cavities, while nearly half of seniors in that age range have gum disease.

The rate of seniors in Grey-Bruce who visited an <u>emergency department</u> due to an oral health condition in 2022 was more than double the provincial average.

"Cost can be a major barrier to accessing oral healthcare. The Canadian Dental Care Plan and Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program help to address this barrier by covering the cost of many oral treatments for eligible seniors," Weppler says.

Grey Bruce Public Health and Bruce County are working together to help promote the two dental care plans to seniors in the area. A social media campaign will be launched to help inform residents of the two programs, including the eligibility criteria, covered services, and how to apply. Posters and other educational materials will also be posted in area communities.

"Good oral health is essential for overall well-being, especially for seniors. The Bruce County Long Term Care & Senior Services department encourages all eligible seniors to utilize these dental care programs," says Megan Garland, Bruce County Director of Long Term Care & Senior Services. "Regular dental visits not only keep teeth and gums healthy, but also support overall health and enhance quality of life. Seniors in need of support with navigating these dental programs can email seniorservices@brucecounty.on.ca."

PROVINCIAL AND FEDERAL DENTAL CARE PROGRAMS

The Ontario Seniors Dental Care Program covers the cost of routine dental services, including check-ups, cleanings, x-rays, fillings, and treatment of gum conditions, for qualifying seniors aged 65 and older who meet income requirements and do not have other forms of dental benefits.

Services covered by the OSDCP are provided at <u>Grey Bruce Public Health dental clinics</u>, located in Owen Sound, Walkerton, Markdale, and Wiarton.

Meanwhile, seniors with an adjusted net family income of less than \$90,000 and no dental insurance can also apply for the Canadian Dental Care Plan, which covers the cost of a range of oral health services.

Qualifying patients can receive services covered by the federal program at any private dental clinic that accepts CDCP clients. GBPH clinics do not provide services covered by the CDCP.

Seniors may qualify for assistance under both the federal and provincial programs.
