Discussion:

The SCADA upgrades at the Point Clark Pumping Station had to be extended into 2021 with the unexpected abandonment and commissioning of the wells in Blairs Grove, which was completed in January 2021. The upgrades in Point Clark were completed in February 2021.

The monitoring of sewage flows in Lucknow began in the fall 2020 and will conclude in the spring of 2021. The inspection of all accessible sanitary maintenance holes in Lucknow was completed in 2020 and about 30% of the maintenance holes were cleaned also. Reducing inflow and infiltration in the Lucknow sanitary system is the

most economical solution we currently have to increase sewage capacity and accommodate future growth.

Treasurer's Comments:

The water and wastewater systems are user pay. All expenditures are funded through user fees and capital costs are funded from reserves generated by user fees. There is no impact on the tax rate.
