**Discussion:**

Point Clark Harbour Wall Parking Lot Section

Staff has received a permit from the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) for the harbour wall and parking lot section. The permit is conditional that the work be completed before October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Staff is requesting that the work may be completed in January or February when the near shore is frozen. Both the contractor and staff agree that the work would be better quality with no wave action to deal with. We are now soliciting the Department of Oceans and Fisheries for comments, and the Saugeen Ojibway Nation for approvals if possible. Staff has also been assisting the Point Clark Boat Club with their Harbour wall restoration permit. Working together will hopefully provide some efficiencies for the contractor.

Lake Shore Erosion

Staff have been monitoring the lakeshore erosion closely. The erosion between the 12<sup>th</sup> concession and the boundary is the most concerning. BM Ross have completed

a site inspection along with the Saugeen Valley Conservation Authority staff. Staff is waiting for a report to provide further comment.

### Portable Washrooms and Garbage Cans

Staff traditionally remove the Lakeshore portable washrooms and garbage cans after Labour Day and intend to do the same in 2020.
