FCM Board targets federal budget

FCM's elected Board of Directors met online last week to shape national priorities for the road ahead. From Tuesday through Friday, members of our committees, forums and regional caucuses rolled up their sleeves in the policy trenches. Board members welcomed Halifax councillor Lindell Smith as chair of a new Standing Committee on Anti-Racism and Equity and adopted FCM's annual corporate plan.

A big theme all week: shaping Federal Budget 2021. This next budget needs to empower municipal leaders to continue protecting Canadians on the front lines of COVID-19. But it also needs to gear up for a strong, community-rooted national recovery. FCM's recommendations include building on proven funding tools—from the Gas Tax Fund to the Rapid Housing initiative—to reliably create good jobs and build better lives in communities of all sizes, in every part of the country.

FCM intervenes in Supreme Court case on cuts to Toronto City Council

Tomorrow, FCM will be intervening at the Supreme Court in a case surrounding the Ontario government's decision to unilaterally reduce the size of Toronto City Council. Bill 5, also known as the Better Local Government Act, redrew Toronto City Council's electoral structure, reducing the number of city wards and councillors from 47 to 25. Enacted in 2018, Bill 5 made these significant changes while Toronto was already in the midst of a municipal election. Our intervention is funded by FCM's Legal Defense Fund.





Critical new support for municipal infrastructure

Dear FCM members,

Earlier today Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland announced a doubling of next year's federal Gas Tax Fund transfer to municipalities, growing it by \$2.2 billion. The federal government is also proposing to rename this tool—as the *Canada Community Building Fund*—to reflect its essential value.

Today's announcement is an important step toward the strong, community-rooted recovery Canadians deserve—and it responds to one of FCM's key recommendations for the upcoming federal budget.

As you know, the GTF is the most proven and reliable tool we have to strengthen municipal infrastructure. Every year, it directly empowers communities of all sizes—rural, urban, northern and remote—to move the best local projects forward. Whether

that means fixing a local bridge, upgrading a wastewater facility, or retrofitting a recreation centre.

The GTF works because it recognizes our frontline expertise as the governments closest to daily life. Doubling next year's transfer means more local jobs, real economic growth, and better lives for the people we serve. And that's exactly what we'll need to drive a strong and truly nationwide post-pandemic recovery.

Today's announcement responds to FCM's recommendation to grow the GTF transfer as a key tool for economic recovery. That's one part of our wider call for a national recovery that's rooted in cities and communities—the places where Canadians live, work and raise their families, and where people continue to live the realities of this pandemic.

Looking ahead, FCM will continue to advocate for a community-led recovery—starting with the April 19 federal budget. [Our budget recommendations](#) include bold action to tackle housing insecurity, support local disaster mitigation, strengthen rural communities and tackle western economic anxiety. And we continue to call for a durable solution to municipal budget shortfalls, for the duration of the pandemic.

Today's announcement is thanks to FCM's collective strength—and to your hard work. It reinforces what we've been saying all along: that municipalities are essential partners in driving Canada's recovery. Together, local leaders stand ready to turn this investment into good jobs and better lives in communities of all sizes across the country.



WEST op-ed: priorities for Budget 2021

The chairs of FCM's Western Economic Solutions Taskforce (WEST) have published an op-ed calling on the federal government to take immediate action in Budget 2021 to support western communities. They also highlighted WEST's budget recommendations to help protect western jobs, families, and industries.

The op-ed has appeared in a number of newspapers, including the *Regina Leader-Post*, *Saskatoon Star Phoenix*, *Edmonton Journal*, *Edmonton Sun*, *Edmonton Examiner*, and *Calgary Herald*. This widespread publication shows the importance of WEST's budget asks, as well as the strength of our collective voice.

FCM argues for local democracy at the Supreme Court

On March 16, FCM intervened at the Supreme Court of Canada to defend local democracy in the City of Toronto's appeal against Bill 5, which completely re-wrote municipal electoral boundaries during an ongoing election. The hearing reflected the active conversations happening across the country about the modern role of local governments in our national architecture, with leading rights advocates from across the country calling on the Supreme Court to protect free and fair elections at the local level.

The Alberta Ecotrust Foundation announced the receipt of their \$43.4 million endowment from the federal government on March 17. Part of the Low Carbon Cities Canada (LC3) network, they will host two LC3 Centres in the cities of Edmonton and Calgary, supporting both cities as they reach their carbon emissions reduction targets and achieve their respective climate goals.

The LC3 network is made possible by an endowment from the Government of Canada, with funds distributed by FCM's Green Municipal Fund.




