## Mayor Tory & Toronto City Council call for phase-out of Ontario's gas plants

Last night Mayor John Tory and Toronto City Council passed a resolution requesting the Government of Ontario to develop and implement a plan to phase-out all gas-fired electricity generation as soon as possible.



The resolution, which was approved by a vote of 21 to 2, was moved by Councillor Jennifer McKelvie and seconded by Councillor Mike Layton.

The motion was opposed by Councillors Denzil Minnan-Wong and Stephen Holyday.

The motion was also strongly opposed by [Ontario Power Generation, Enbridge](#) and the Ontario Energy Association (e.g., [Enbridge, TC Energy and Shell](#)).

**The following 21 municipalities have now passed resolutions requesting the Government of Ontario to phase-out our province's gas-fired power plants:** Toronto, County of Peterborough, Mississauga, Brampton, Niagara Falls, Temiskaming Shores, Ajax, Orangeville, Kingston, Waterloo, Guelph, Cobourg, St. Catharines, King, Woolwich, Selwyn, Windsor, Burlington, Hamilton, Halton Hills and Kitchener.

## **Kinectrics and Bruce Power celebrate grand opening of Teeswater laundry facility**

**TIVERTON, ON – March 26, 2021** – In a virtual event held today, Bruce Power and Kinectrics celebrated the grand opening of Kinectrics' fully operational laundry facility in Teeswater which is creating and sustaining jobs in the community of South Bruce.

The 40,000 square-foot facility now launders personal protective equipment (PPE) from Bruce Power and was designed with sufficient capacity to service the CANDU fleet in Ontario and beyond using highly-automated, environmentally-sensitive laundry equipment. Kinectrics employs more than 40 people at its Teeswater location with potential to increase employment over the next few years.

“We are thrilled to see this facility up and running and fully operational,” said David Harris, Kinectrics' President and CEO. “This community provides an outstanding platform to grow our business both with Bruce Power and our clients worldwide. We look forward to providing long-term employment for the next generation of workers as we support world-class nuclear operators like Bruce Power.”

Kinectrics designed and constructed the facility in 2019 and have engineered it to have the lowest impact on the environment and local utilities with laundry water recycling systems engineered to recycle up to 80-90 per cent of all laundry water. This is Kinectrics' third of four locations in the region as it celebrated the opening of the cornerstone of its Bruce County expansion, a 37,000-square-foot building at the Bruce Energy Centre, near Tiverton in 2017. Kinectrics purchased a second facility at 8 Mitchel St. in Teeswater in 2020 to support co-ordinating services for its laundry programs and also has an office in Kincardine.

“Kinectrics has made a significant investment in our regional economy expanding its capabilities within the Clean Energy Frontier,” said Mike Rencheck, President and CEO of Bruce Power. “Work previously performed outside of our country is now being done here at home, creating jobs and careers for Canadians. Our technology innovation creates economic benefits that will strengthen our rural areas, communities, and industry. As a founding member of the Nuclear Innovation Institute, Kinectrics is establishing itself as a leader in clean nuclear energy technology.”

Lisa Thompson, Minister of Government and Consumer Services and MPP for Huron-Bruce, attended the virtual event and congratulated Kinectrics on its latest milestone.

“This is indeed great news for the community of Teeswater and for Bruce County,” Thompson said. “The Life-Extension Program underway at Bruce Power continues to be a driving force in our local community and the work being done at Bruce Power is drawing companies like Kinectrics to the region, creating good jobs, new investment and ensuring Huron-Bruce and our province are open for business.”

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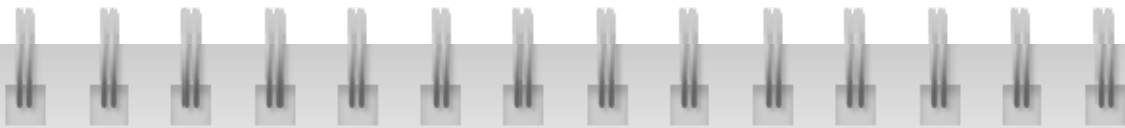

## **New video tours Goderich Water Treatment Plant**

A new video shows how the raw water source from Lake Huron is treated at the Goderich Water Treatment Plant to become clean, safe municipal drinking water for the town's residents, businesses and visitors. The video is the third in a local drinking water series.

Ausable Bayfield Maitland Valley Source Protection Committee (SPC) released the [video](#) on March 24, 2021.

The virtual tour of the Goderich Water Treatment Plant is hosted by John Graham, Environmental Representative on the SPC and Project Manager with Veolia Water Canada Inc.

Cory Dulong, Senior Lead Operator, also helps take viewers through the complex system from intake pipe, screening debris, initial treatment, filtering, chlorination and continual testing to distribution through the Goderich water system – an eight-hour process.

The new video encourages people to protect Lake Huron, especially near the drinking water intake at Goderich.

“It's very important that residents and visitors all know that the intake protection zone is essential because we draw our water from this area,” John says in the video.

The most vulnerable area for the Goderich surface water system is a one-kilometre ring around the mouth of the intake pipe and includes the Goderich



harbour and waterfront beaches. He also provides a water conservation message.

“It is important to be mindful of water usage at all times because there’s a limited amount of fresh water for our drinking purposes,” John said. “Water conservation should be on everyone’s minds at all times.”

The source protection committee members are using videos as an effective way to safely reach out to the public during the pandemic.

Prior videos in the series include SPC Industry Rep Rowland Howe on the [Goderich Port Management Corporation efforts to protect water](#) (January 2021); and SPC Public-at-Large Rep Alyssa Keller hosting [a tour of the Seaforth municipal well system and water tower](#) (October 2020).

In [another new video](#), promoting the series, Matt Pearson, SPC Chair, explains that “members of our committee have developed a series of three videos to explain about water from source to tap. Matt said “all of us can do our part to ensure safe drinking water for now and the future.”

The source protection committee will be releasing more videos about protecting our sources of drinking water in the coming weeks, Matt said, “so be sure to watch for them.”

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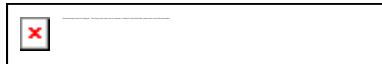

### Seasonal Rate reclassification: Got questions?

If you received a letter from Hydro One over the past month, indicating you will be one of the 147,000 families moved out of the collapsing 'Seasonal Rate' class and into one of three existing density classes, **you may have questions.**



Whether you think you should be moved to an alternate rate classification, or you've changed your usage and need to update Hydro One that you're living there year-round (and therefore eligible for the RRRF subsidy that is NOT available to seasonal residents), **call the Hydro One Contact Centre to discuss your concerns: 1-888-664-9376.**

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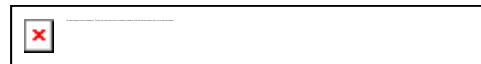

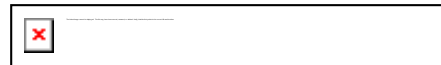
## Partner Updates & Regional Notices

Fully one quarter of the province's electricity comes from this renewable source.

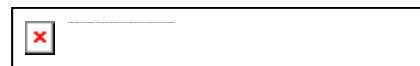

## Waste Bin Site Transition ongoing

The **District Municipality of Muskoka** released its 2020 annual report on the status of the removal of all unlicensed **waste bin sites** by 2023, as mandated by the Ministry of the Environment Conservation and Parks (MECP). **FOCA has several member associations affected by the removal of these waste bins**, which have especially served island cottages at landing points. The plan was modified in mid-2020 due to the pandemic and "on-going waste operations challenges" and is now a multi-year effort of transition planning for each community. ## Tackling climate change in eastern Georgian Bay

**ICECAP** (the Integrated Community Energy and Climate Action Plans) reached a milestone in its first year, recently releasing a model to help participating **Georgian Bay municipalities inventory carbon emissions**. To assist in the calculations, the **Georgian Bay Biosphere** (GBB) developed a '[Carbon Calculator](#)' online tool which can be used by anyone.



Among other things, the results underscore how important boating transportation is to the region. The next steps involve working with each community to set targets to model achievable greenhouse gas emissions and consulting with councils and community members of Local Climate Action Plans. ### Second Grey Bruce Virtual Job Fair April 7; Focus on Student and Seasonal Jobs

In March, more than 1,200 job seekers and 125 employers connected through the Grey Bruce Virtual Job Fair to explore 1,500 local job opportunities. As a response to this high demand, a second Grey Bruce Virtual Job Fair focused on student and seasonal opportunities will take place Wednesday, April 7 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Registration is now open for job seekers through [www.grey.ca](http://www.grey.ca). There is no cost to participate, and job seekers are encouraged to register early and build their profiles. Employment service providers are available to help registrants update their resumes and highlight their skills for prospective employers.
