#### **Recommendation:**

That the Township of Huron-Kinloss Committee of the Whole hereby approves Report Number CS-2021-04-21 prepared by Mike Fair, Director of Community Services AND approves the Supply, installation, and safety surfacing from Play Power for \$38 796.00 plus HST AND FURTHER approves an exemption to the purchasing policy is granted due to the limited source for supply and install bidders AND FURTHER approves the appropriate By-Law coming forward.

#### **Background:**

Capital projects in the 2021 budget include Huronville \$30 000 and Langdon \$12 000. The total budget includes supply and install equipment and wood chip safety surfacing as required. Both parks will have existing outdated swings removed. Langdon park was recently updated with a multi play structure in 2019.

#### Discussion:

Staff has the following recommendations based on the existing play value, while increasing the play value in the park. Attachments include quote for parks and images for both.

# Huronville proposal includes the following:

Arch swing with two tot, and two regular swings, 4 Tikes of Steel, Revolution spinner, Tire combination, 8 ft bench, and a 3-seat table. The revolution spinner is accessible, and the tire combination provide a quiet zone to support autism needs.

# Langdon Park includes the following:

Arch swing with two tot, and two regular swings, and a 3-seat table.

The above equipment meets all CSA standards, and accessibility standards. Excavation will be completed by a local contractor, and funds are remaining in the budget (estimated \$3 000.00) to cover the cost. Staff recommends proceeding with the proposal from Play Power for \$38 796.00 plus HST supplied and installed including safety surfacing.
