That the Township of Huron-Kinloss Committee of the Whole hereby receives for information Report Number CAO-2021-04-16, prepared by Elyse Dewar, Project Coordinator.

Background:

In January 2020, the NWMO announced they had secured the sufficient amount of land in Municipality of South Bruce to continue studies for the DGR. This announcement meant that the Township of Huron-Kinloss was removed from the site-selection process and no longer considered a host community for the project. Two communities remain in the Nuclear Waste Management Organization's (NWMO) site selection process to find a suitable location to store Canada's used nuclear fuel – the Township of Ignace and the Municipality of South Bruce.

Discussion:

NWMO Community Engagement

The Point Clark Beach Association has invited the NWMO to tentatively attend the July 10, 2021 meeting and provide an update on the Adaptive Phased Management project.

The NWMO has also been approached to provide an update to the Huron-Kinloss Mennonite Community, but a date has yet to be determined for this update.

NWMO Implantation Plan

The NWMO has published its new five-year strategic plan, titled <u>Implementing</u> <u>Adaptive Phased Management 2021 to 2025</u>. This report sets the stage for taking the organization beyond planning and site selection for Canada's plan for the safe, long-term management of used nuclear fuel.

Public input is key to our work, and we are inviting Canadians and Indigenous peoples to fill out <u>our online survey</u> and help shape our plans as they continue to progress.

The next five years will see the NWMO move from an organization that is planning to build a repository to one that is implementing that plan, as we anticipate selecting a single, preferred site for Canada's plan in 2023.

NWMO Annual Report

The NWMO has also released its <u>2020 annual report</u>. The <u>report outlines</u> how the NWMO pulled together to keep Canada's plan on track and support the communities with which we work during this challenging period. It summarizes the NWMO's activities throughout 2020 and provides an audited update on the organization's finances.

NWMO Releases Climate Change Reports

The NWMO has released two new reports developed by Golder Associates Ltd. That examine how the climate may change in each of the two areas remaining in the NWMO site selection process – South Bruce and Ignace.

The reports found that in both potential siting areas, precipitation and temperatures are likely to increase, and the summer months are projected to become drier over the next century and beyond.
