There were 12 permits for single family dwellings in March; six in Point Clark, three in the Northern Lakeshore Area, two in the former Huron Township and one in Ripley. To date 38 permits have been issued for new residences.

To date, the Township has issued 24 permits for private septic system.

The total value of construction for the year will be inflated due to the high cost of building materials but these numbers are still way above what is normal for the municipality. A good gauge for growth is the number of new dwelling permits issued to date. For 2020, 2019 and 2018 respectively, we issued 42, 34 and 34 Single Family Dwelling permits. We have matched those number at the one-third mark of 2021.

These are early signs that Huron-Kinloss is going to see substantial growth in 2021
