Budget 2021: Significant news for rural communities

Dear members,

Yesterday's federal budget delivered on FCM recommendations that will significantly empower rural communities on the road to a strong post-COVID recovery.

From the beginning, we've called for a national recovery plan that empowers the rural and remote communities that drive a third of this country's economy. We're now seeing that play out in the effective advocacy your communities are doing through FCM. Make no mistake: yesterday's wins are a sign that rural Canada is being heard.

Federal Budget 2021 includes:

- Major broadband funding: \$1 billion over six years for the Universal Broadband Fund, for a new total of \$2.75 billion in direct funding to improve rural and remote Internet access.
- Climate adaptation funding: \$1.4 billion over 12 years for the Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund—setting aside \$670 million for smaller projects (\$1–20 million) to ease access for rural and remote communities (responding to FCM's recommendation).
- **Community infrastructure funding:** \$500 million for local projects to be administered by the regional development agencies.
- Compensation for farmers: \$100 million in support for farmers in provinces where the federal carbon tax applies (Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario).
- **Employer supports:** \$57.6 million in 2021-22 to expand the Mandatory Isolation Support for Temporary Foreign Workers Program to help employers offset costs associated with temporary foreign workers fulfilling isolation requirements upon entering Canada.
- Community Workforce Development Program: \$55 million over three years in this new program, serving local and regional economic priorities as well as national priorities like de-carbonization and supporting workers in transforming sectors, with a focus on under-represented groups.

These steps add to major progress achieved just before the budget. On March 25, the federal government committed to doubling next year's Gas Tax Fund transfer. This \$2.2 billion injection will directly empower communities of all sizes to move more infrastructure projects forward. Four days later, our federal partners announced the first-ever dedicated fund for rural transit needs.

We'll be working with our federal partners on the design and implementation of new commitments—to ensure programs work for municipalities and maximize impact on the ground. That includes ensuring the rollout of new investments through the Reaching Home program includes targeted supports for rural and remote homelessness, as FCM has strongly recommended.

This budget is a clear sign that the federal government understands that municipalities of all sizes are essential partners on the road to recovery. That puts us in a very strong position ahead of a federal election that could come as early as this spring.

Our communities are where Canadians are living, working and raising their children through the pandemic. They're also where Canada's post-COVID recovery needs to take root. Thanks to our strong and united voice—led by FCM—this budget is a step toward that goal.

By responding to several key FCM recommendations, last week's federal budget will help municipalities build a stronger post-COVID Canada.

Big-ticket items include billion-dollar-plus investments in the Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund, Universal Broadband Fund, Rapid Housing Initiative and National Trade Corridors Fund. This budget heeds FCM's call for measures that empower communities of all sizes—from boosting rural broadband, to reserving significant adaptation funding for smaller projects, to actioning proposals from FCM's Western Economic Solutions Taskforce.

From here, FCM will work hard to ensure the rollout of these commitments works for municipalities. We'll continue pressing recommendations that were not actioned at the scale we need—including on housing. And we'll do that with eyes on a federal election that could come as early as this spring.
