# Dedicated rural transit fund announced today

Dear rural FCM members,

This morning, Minister of Infrastructure Catherine McKenna and Minister of Rural Economic Development Maryam Monsef <u>announced the details of the new rural transit fund</u>—the first ever federal fund dedicated to the transit needs of rural, remote and small communities.

The rural transit fund, first announced in February as part of the federal government's long-term transit plan, will include \$250 million over five years to support innovative mobility solutions in rural and remote communities. The funding will be available to support a wide range of delivery models, including on-demand services, to meet local transit priorities.

This announcement is a positive step that responds to years of robust advocacy by FCM and Rural Forum members. We have consistently called for dedicated

investments in rural transit to support growth, promote equality, build communities, and help the environment—and today's announcement is a direct result of our work. This funding comes in addition to previously announced investments in active transportation, which will also directly benefit rural and remote communities.

I particularly want to thank Rural Forum members for their comprehensive feedback and advice on the rural transit fund following February's announcement of the long-term transit plan. We will keep working with you and all rural municipalities on next steps, including program design, to ensure a rural lens is applied to this funding and that rural and remote transit needs are met.

I encourage you to share today's news with your communities and online. Please see quotes below in response to the announcement as a sample message.

"Rural municipalities across the country are welcoming this funding announcement. This first-ever dedicated fund for rural transit will support innovative solutions to improve mobility in smaller communities, a major priority for the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. Last Monday, the federal government announced its first-ever dedicated fund for **rural transit**. Days earlier, we'd learned that the federal **Gas Tax Fund** transfer will be doubled for 2021-2022, helping *every* municipality launch job-creating infrastructure projects.

Both steps respond to FCM recommendations. These steps also signal that our bigger message is getting through. In a nutshell: for a strong, inclusive and truly national recovery from COVID-19, we'll need to empower local leaders in communities of all sizes.

The federal budget expected April 19 is an opportunity to move forward. And FCM is keeping municipal priorities front and centre—from housing vulnerable Canadians, to growing disaster mitigation tools, to applying a strong rural lens to Canada's recovery effort.

# FCM's GMF announces \$23 million for Zibi District Energy

The Zibi Development, located in the National Capital Region, is transforming decades-old brownfield lands into a carbon-neutral development that will house over 5,000 residents and provide prime commercial space. Last week, FCM's Green Municipal Fund (GMF) and the Government of Canada

announced funding for Zibi District Energy's Post-Industrial Waste Heat Recovery for Residential and Commercial Space Heating project.

By leveraging waste industrial heat, river-coupled cooling and locally generated hydroelectricity to eliminate GHG emissions, the project will eliminate GHG emissions from building heating and cooling operations. Once fully operational, the system will have net-zero CO2e emissions.

GMF is a \$1.65 billion endowment from the Government of Canada that helps municipalities implement sustainability projects and emission-reducing policies.
