Summer Students

Staff has hired two additional summer students including Sadie Pollock for Parks, and Hailey Farrell for summer camp and parks. Both students started on June 28th, 2021.

Beach Access on Huron Road

The new beach access project on Huron Rd in Point Clark is progressing. Staff have been working with adjacent neighbours to ensure a smooth installation. Tree contractors are scheduled to remove trees on Wednesday June 30th, 2021. The cedar lumber for the fencing is being sourced locally and should be available mid-July. Upon receipt of the lumber, the fence installers will proceed with the wood fence. The beach access will be opened once the fence is installed, and then the beach access signage can also be installed and ready for public use.

GovDeals

Staff has listed some of the surplus items that were not purchased internally. Those items have been listed on GovDeals, to avoid landfilling the items. Items included antique doors, bathroom fixtures, cupboards. The closing date is July 8th, 2021.

2021 Environment Fund

Staff attempted to submit a grant application to the Environment Fund. Unfortunately, the deadline passed before all the required supporting documents could be attained for the submission. The funding application was for Boiler Beach naturalization, in addition to the Dickies Creek project in progress by Lasse Jakobsen. Staff will continue to seek out other funding options for both projects.

Ash Tree Removal

Staff is preparing options for continued removal of significant quantities of Ash Trees that are in Green Spaces throughout the Township that pose high risks to adjacent properties. Staff will bring forward a detailed report with mapping to the August Committee meeting with a recommended path forward.
