

INTRODUCTION AND HIGHLIGHTS

It has certainly been a busy year from a legislative and advocacy perspective at AMCTO!

If you attended our AGM on June 16th, you will have heard some of the highlights of this work from 2020-2021 Legislative and Policy Advisory Committee (LPAC) Chair Stephen O'Brien. You can read about the significant advocacy accomplishments in our 2020 AMCTO Annual Report.

During our conference, AMCTO policy and government relations staff had the opportunity to connect with members and discuss a few policy issues and concerns. Members and conference delegates were also given the opportunity to provide input on future AMCTO advocacy initiatives through our peer-networking forums. A few topics raised were joint and several liability and its impact on municipal insurance and AODA compliance. As a reminder, delegates still have access to the conference platform and are welcome to continue to provide their ideas through these forums.

The Ontario Legislature originally rose for summer recess on June 3rd with a scheduled return for September 13th, 2021. However, as you may have seen, the legislature was recalled on June 10th to consider implementation of the notwithstanding clause to allow recent amendments to the *Election Finances Act, 2020*, which applies to Provincial elections, to stand. A ruling by the Ontario Superior Court deemed the changes unconstitutional. Given the majority of the Legislature, the Government was able pass legislation to invoke the clause.

We will continue to monitor regulatory postings and evaluate opportunities to participate in consultations over the summer months.

POLICY SPOTLIGHT

Our team is currently developing a written submission to the Consultation on Strengthening Codes of Conduct based on member feedback and advice from LPAC. As part of the consultation, AMCTO board members participated in a stakeholder roundtable session on May 26th with the Ontario Municipal Administrators Association (OMAA) and Associate Minister, Jill Dunlop, who prior to the Cabinet Shuffle on June 18th (see Policy Updates below) was leading the consultation. We expect the new Associate Minister for the file, Jane McKenna, to now lead these consultations. During this session, we reported on the following concerns that we heard from members through our feedback survey:

- Primary consideration should be for the safety of staff and members of the public;
- From a Council-Staff relations perspective, municipal staff should not be involved in enforcement:
- It is important to be mindful of the municipal operational and administrative burden of any new mechanism;

• It is important to set standards and regulations on qualifications for Integrity Commissioners, any enhanced training needed, and associated costs for their services.

Overall, the discussion was very positive and brought to light many important factors for the ministries to consider related to municipal codes of conduct.

Another project our team is developing is a priorities document to share with political parties as they begin to turn their attentions to the Provincial election next June.

This includes priorities that have been identified by members, LPAC and our board that continue to require the attention or action of the provincial government. The goal is for this document to inform conversations around municipal matters of interest with mainstream Ontario political parties in advance of the next election. AMCTO members will also be encouraged to use this document to provide local candidates with an overview of collective concerns and some sample messaging on these issues.

BILLS AND LAWMAKING

Bills Passed:

Bill 282: *Moving Ontarians More Safely Act, 2021*: The bill makes amendments to the *Highway Traffic Act* with respect to motor assisted bicycles and power-assisted bicycles, increases penalties for racing motor vehicles on highways. It also enacts the *Towing and Storage Safety and Enforcement Act, 2021* to regulate the provision of towing services and vehicle storage services and sets requirements, standards and prohibitions to address the protection of users of towing services and vehicle storage services (among other things).

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Bill 276: Supporting Recovery and Competitiveness Act, 2021: This omnibus bill makes amendments to several pieces of legislation in 28 schedules under the auspices of reducing red tape and assisting with economic recovery from COVID-19.

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Bill 257: Supporting Broadband and Infrastructure Expansion Act, 2021: enacts the Building Broadband Faster Act, 2021. The purpose of the Act is to expedite the delivery of broadband projects of provincial significance. The Act applies with respect to broadband projects that are designated by regulation. It also makes amendments to the Planning Act to provide that ministerial zoning orders made under section 47 are not required and are deemed to never have been required to be consistent with policy statements.

Bill 260: Stopping Harassment and Abuse by Local Leaders Act, 2001 (First Reading): The bill would amend the Municipal Act and City of Toronto Act to require codes of conduct for members of council and local boards to include a requirement to adhere to workplace violence and harassment policies. It would also permit municipal councils and local boards to direct the Integrity Commission to apply to the courts to vacate a member's seat if the Commissioner's inquiry determines that the member has contravened the code of conduct by failing to comply with the workplace violence or harassment policies.



Advocacy Update: Submission to the Province's Strengthening Municipal Codes of Conduct consultation

As you are aware, the Province launched consultations on strengthening accountability for municipal council members.

The consultation was based on three guiding questions:

- What changes or mechanisms are needed to better hold council members accountable for municipal code of conduct violations?
- How can codes of conduct be more effectively enforced?
- Are a broader range of penalties for codes of conduct violations needed?

In April, we asked you, our members, to provide feedback on some key questions to help inform our submission. Your feedback also helped to inform roundtable discussions between our Board and the former minister responsible for the consultation.

The content of our final submission is based on the principle that protecting the health, safety and well-being of municipal staff, elected officials and the public is paramount. Our submission is framed to emphasize that municipal staff should not be put in the awkward position of enforcing codes. We also emphasize that the Province must think about implementation issues and provide guidance to support municipal staff on any new accountability mechanisms.

We also took the opportunity in our submission to address other considerations for strengthening accountability and transparency on the topics of council-staff relations, operational and administrative burden, and improving standards for integrity commissioners — issues that we have raised previously and continue to focus our advocacy efforts on.

Thank you to everyone who contributed feedback. We look forward to continuing to work together with you and the Province on strengthening accountability to build a safer and stronger municipal sector.


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
