#### **Recommendation:**

That the Township of Huron-Kinloss Committee of the Whole hereby approves Report Number CS2021-08-42 prepared by Mike Fair, Director of Community Services and authorizes staff to request quotes for Ash tree removal.

# **Background:**

The Township of Huron-Kinloss owns many parcels of land, and some of which contain many deteriorating ash trees due to the emerald ash borer.

The priority now is to have the ash trees safely cut down and removed to avoid injury and protect property. There are other trees on other Township owned property, however staff have determined the following parcels of forests with ash trees should be dealt with sooner than later. Priority has been given to quantity of ash trees, proximity of trees to residential homes, and extent of ash borer damage.

Staff will request for quotes the removal of every ash tree within the property limits outlined by maps attached

Staff will consult with the SVCA, and the Coastal Centre regarding a recommended planting guide, and tree list for reforestation for each area. The planting program could proceed as early as the fall of 2022.

# Discussion:

The parcel maps are attached for your review.

The following parcel properties are listed in priority: Lakeside of old shore road allowance (Huron Road), upper end of Clarks Creek, Blairs Grove, Lake Range Slope, Whitechurch Park, Green Acres Trail, Shady wood and Lake Range, Heritage Rd.

Staff will report back with the quotes to determine costs, and extent of work to be completed with budget considerations at that time.
