EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ADDRESS

Since 1984, our focus has been to enable life-changing mentoring relationships to ignite the power and potential in the young people we serve in Kincardine & District.

"Change" was the theme for 2019. We began a new and incredibly successful fundraiser, Dancing with the Stars; re-imagined our Ladies Golf for Kids Sake Golf Tournament, making the 2019 tournament our most successful Ladies Golf tournament to date; saw the end of our classic fundraiser, Bowl for Kids Sake; and celebrated the launch of a new image and brand Nationwide.

In September, Big Brothers Big Sister of Canada launched our new brand, which included new mission and vision statements, new logos and colours, the Theory of Change, and the 40 Developmental Assets, a new way to track outcomes through sound research and data collection.

We celebrated our new brand at our "Party in the Park" on Big Brothers Big Sisters Day, September 18th. We recognized our incredible army of dedicated and valuable volunteers, without whom this agency could not exist.

In the fall, we began preparations for another new, spectacular fundraiser, "The Bippity Boppity Boo Bash". This fun, family focused fundraiser was held in February 2020. The response was overwhelming and we exceeded our fundraising goals.

We received our accreditation through BBBS Canada. This seal of accreditation signifies that we are working hard to meet the National Standards to deliver safe, high quality services to the young people and their families that we serve.

In March of this year, I had the pleasure of attending Queen's park with the other 44 Ontario Agencies. We met with Premier Doug Ford and key Ministers to share that Big Brother Big Sisters is an essential service. Our ask was an additional \$4.5 million in funding for In School Mentoring Programs, in a multi-year funding program. This fall, we plan to launch In School Mentoring in Kincardine.

In spite of the challenges we are facing during this new normal, we have shown our resilience and determination to meet the needs of our young people and their families by connecting our Bigs and Littles online with Virtual Programming.

I am honoured and humbled to be a part of this incredible organization, to work alongside creative and innovative staff, board members, and volunteers as we continue to invest in the lives of our young people.








THANK YOU

My son has been part of the program for the last 3 years and he has had the opportunity to meet lots of great adults and kids, go to different fun and interesting places as well as get some experiences he wouldn't otherwise get to be part of. I am a single parent working a full time job as a computer tech at Bruce Power and sometimes I struggle to be able to get the time and energy to take him out and do these things. Sometimes the work day is so long that when I come home I don't have the energy to drive him to these programs but most of the time it's because I am working shift work and won't be home to drive him on time. Luckily he doesn't have to miss out, as there are adult volunteer drivers who take the time out of their busy day to come and pick up and/or drop off my son. My son is 10 years old and looks forward to both the boys group and special events and activities. Sometimes the activities are just all around fun for the kids, such as sailing, BBQ's and fun time at the local school gym. Other times they are giving back to the community by doing something like picking up trash, or helping the elderly in town with their yard work. It has encouraged us to go out as a family as well and do things to help our community/environment such as going to an area where we know trash and bottles get thrown out a lot and cleaning them all up ourselves.

One year ago my son was matched with a Big Brother, and it has been so amazing for him to have someone who takes the time every single week to spend time with him. His Big Brother takes him to his place and they jump on the trampoline and gather sticks in the woods for fires, they go swimming together and have fires and hot dogs in the back yard. When the weather is nice his Big Brother bikes to our house to get him, they bike down to the beach to swim and play in the sand before biking back. One time he even came up and grabbed my son's bike to fill the tires for us. Last summer my son invited his Big Brother to his birthday party. I told him that he is busy and not to hold it against him if he can't come as he works shift work. But he showed up to the birthday party to see my son and made him feel so special. My son's Big Brother has made it clear since the beginning that he plans to be consistent and wants to spend time with him every week if at all possible.

My son's Big Brother and the Big Brothers program has helped him through tough times and this program means so much to us because of that support we both get. Without the Big Brothers and Sisters program my son wouldn't have a supportive mentor in his life. We feel so blessed. This program is welcoming and supportive for all kinds of different kids with different personalities and experiences and home lives. ~ Sarah S, Parent
