THAT the Township of Huron-Kinloss Committee of the Whole hereby approves Report Number PW-2022-03-21, prepared by John Yungblut, Director of Public Works AND grants pre-budget approval in the acceptance of the quotation from Wesley Riley Contracting Company Ltd. for the processing of coarse aggregate at Con. 7 PT Lot 26 Kinloss at the unit price of \$2.10 plus HST per tonne AND grants an exemption to the Purchasing and Procurement Policy. AND FURTHER authorizes the appropriate by-law coming forward

Background:

In September 2021, the Township entered into an agreement with the owners of Con. 7 PT Lot 26 in the former Kinloss Township that will allow for the extraction of surplus aggregate from the site. The removal of this material is necessary for the construction of a house and barn on the vacant property. The report from Sept. 8, 2021 is attached to this report for reference.

We are planning to crush approximately 20,000 tonnes of aggregate into granular "A" in 2022 and another 20,000 tonnes in 2023 if the results from this year's project is found to be satisfactory to all parties involved.

Discussion:

Township staff have issued a tender for the crushing of coarse gravel at our existing gravel pit in the past, however, we have had mixed results with the quality of gravel produced when awarding to the lowest bidder. We have had excellent results from

working with Riley Contracting in recent years and Township staff find the price quoted to be a fair offer.

Financial Impacts:

The proposed 2022 Operating Budget has allocated \$278,750 for gravel resurfacing and this project will allow staff to resurface significantly more roads that we did in 2021 at a similar total cost.
