





Agriculture Business Impact Study – Questionnaire

Huron-Kinloss

The Municipality of South Bruce is one of two communities remaining in the site selection process for the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) Project, which will store Canada's used nuclear fuel in a deep geological repository (DGR).

There are over 40 studies planned or underway in South Bruce and the region, which will help the community explore and consider the NWMO Project. The Project will only move forward if it is proven safe for people and the environment, the community demonstrates willingness to host it, and it will provide meaningful benefits to the community. Some studies are being led by the Municipality of South Bruce, and some by the NWMO.

One of the municipally led studies is the Agriculture Business Impact Study. This study will identify:

- the existing agricultural/agri-business profile of the local area
- the potential for the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) Project to change the agriculture/agri-business operations in the area
- potential strategies for use of the NWMO lands to facilitate new agri-business entrants
- potential strategies, if needed, to address a potential change in the value of the agricultural products.

Leading the study on behalf of the Municipality is MDB Insight, an experienced and respected consulting firm. Their consultants will be involved throughout the development of research and analysis for the Agriculture Business Impact Study, including all stakeholder engagement aspects.

The Municipality of South Bruce has a positive working relationship with the Township of Huron-Kinloss. Huron-Kinloss is not only a direct neighbouring community, but also a former siting community that participated in the NWMO site selection process.

Although Huron-Kinloss is no longer participating in the NWMO site selection process, the Township and its residents are significant stakeholders and will be directly affected if the DGR is located in South Bruce. Recognizing that the proposed site in South Bruce is in close proximity to the Township of Huron-Kinloss, the scope of the Agriculture Business Impact Study was adjusted so to allow agriculture/agri-business stakeholders from Huron Kinloss that live within a 5km radius of the South Bruce site, the opportunity to provide input that will inform this study.

There will also be a workshop hosted by MDB Insight on **Thursday, March 10, 2022 at 1:00pm** for agriculture and agribusiness stakeholders in Huron-Kinloss to develop a draft vision for agriculture business in the region taking the NWMO Project into consideration.
