CALLS FOR SERVICE

South Bruce OPP Major Crime Unit executed a successful warrant in Lucknow at the end of September, gathering evidence to support earlier charges laid of Aggravated Assault and Assault with a Weapon. While conducting the warrant Methamphetamine was also seized and 7 outstanding arrest warrants were cleared.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

During the first week of November, South Bruce OPP had 14 theft occurrences reported. A large scale investigation ensued that identified two suspects. Numerous units were engaged over a week's time period including Canine, Aviation Services, Emergency Response Team, Community Street Crimes Unit, neighbouring OPP detachments and other Municipal Police Services. This investigation resulted in the recovery of a large amount of stolen property including an Off Road Vehicle, a Snow Machine, numerous chain saws and assorted tools. The two suspects were eventually arrested and charged with these offences.

The second year of the Community Safety and Policing grant for Human Trafficking and Sexual Violence was focused on Youth. The Anti-Human Trafficking Committee purchased a curriculum for the Bluewater District School Board and the Grey Bruce Catholic District School Board. A training session was created and the GBCDSB Mental Health Leads attended the training in person in December 2021. An online version of the training was also created and will be provided to the BWDSB.

- The Anti-HT Committee also created two training videos in 2021. One is an Awareness video and was included in the packages for the School Boards.
 The other is a training video for officers. Approximately 20 School Resource officers from the OPP and Municipal Police Services across Grey Bruce, Huron, Perth and Wellington attended an in person training session in December 2021.
- The focus of the Committee for 2022 is education and awareness for Service Providers and continued training for the general public and officers.

- Our partnership with the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) to create the Mobile Mental Health and Addictions Response Team completed it's first full year.
- The clinicians are provided an office in our Walkerton detachment and respond to Mental Health and Addictions related calls for service with our officers.
- From May 2021 our officers have attended over 60 Calls for Service with MMHART workers successfully providing resources and support to those struggling with mental health and addictions issues. Officers have also made 150 referrals to MMHART after the fact.

South Bruce OPP has actively participated as a partner in the refresh of the Situation Table – Acute Risk (STAR) program facilitated by the Community Safety and Well Being Committee. STAR plays a critical role in connecting individuals and families, who are at acutely elevated risk, with services and support. The Situation Table is a collaborative of the Municipalities of Bruce and Grey, Police Services and social services and community-based organizations that identify and support individuals at an acutely elevated risk of harm, committing an offence, or coming into contact with the police or other crisis-driven services.

- From it's inception in 2016 (5 Years) STAR had facilitated 17 Situation Tables for people identified to be at Acute Risk.
- Since the refresh in 2021 starting on July 1st, 8 situations have been successfully facilitated. With each success we anticipate even more referrals.

South Bruce Officers participated in a Cops for Cancer fundraiser in October 2021 cycling just over 40 kms from our Walkerton office to the Kincardine office. Over \$3000.00 was raised for this great cause.

- We welcomed four new recruits in 2021. Three more recruits just arrived the first week of February. One more is scheduled to arrive at Detachment in the spring.
- We said good-bye to Sgt Keegan WILCOX who was promoted to Staff
 Sergeant and transferred to Grey Bruce OPP.
- We are currently running a Sgt competition in which we hope to identify two new Sgts for South Bruce one in Kincardine and one in Walkerton.
