Pickleball Clinic

The April 28th, 2022, pickleball clinic was attended by fourteen registrants at the Ripley-Huron Community Centre. The capacity was sixteen registrants. The beginner and intermediate clinics were well received by all attendees.

Outdoor Pickleball at Point Clark Community Centre Pavillion

The outdoor pickleball program has over twenty registrants so far to participate Monday to Friday from 930-1130 from May until September on the two asphalt pickleball courts beside the Point Clark Pavillion and Ball Diamond.

Summer Sports update

The Summer Sports Committee has been coordinating the baseball and soccer programs for the summer of 2022. The baseball program includes Blastball, T-Ball, U7, U9, U11, U13 teams with ninety-eight registrants. The Soccer program includes U4, U6, U8, and U10 teams with seventy-seven registrants. The committee is

currently working on coaching selections, scheduling, umpires / referees, and any equipment requirements.

Wolf Summer Camp

The Wolf summer camp operating for four weeks in July is currently full with thirty registrants, and several on the waiting list at this time.
