Background:

Monthly Summary

Veolia Water Canada has prepared a summary of the water and wastewater operations over the past month.

Kincardine Water Supply

The Township has an agreement in place with the Municipality of Kincardine (MoK) that allows us to supply drinking water to their system on a temporary basis. There is a mutual understanding that Huron-Kinloss residents are our first priority if a water supply issue arises during this period.

Kincardine Water Supply

Township staff have received a request from the MoK to switch to water supply from the Lakeshore system during reservoir repairs at their water treatment plant that are planned to begin on May 2nd and finished on May 20th. After discussing this request with our Operating Authority, Veolia Canada, Township staff have granted this request. We generally don't see an increased water demand until warmer weather arrives sometime in June, so we don't anticipate any issues.

Financial Impacts:

Our standard practice is to charge a 25% surplus to our metered water rate to the MoK for the use of the Lakeshore water system.
