Bruce County continues to process record numbers of planning applications

Bruce County Planning and Development continued to receive a record-breaking volume of planning applications through the first quarter of 2022. 110 applications were received in the quarter, compared to the previous record of 108 in the first quarter of 2021.

Bruce County Planning and Development continued to receive a record-breaking volume of planning applications through the first quarter of 2022. 110 applications were received in the quarter, compared to the previous record of 108 in the first quarter of 2021. Planning staff are working to process these applications and bring them forward for decisions.

Large scale development projects that were approved over the last several months will improve the overall housing supply and mix. Examples include:

Final Approval of the West Ridge on the Lake Subdivision in Kincardine, which will provide between 373-447 units in a mix of low medium and high densities;

Draft Approval of the Walker Hill Subdivision in Walkerton, with at least 80 units, including 48 townhouses; Official Plan and Zoning changes for Lord Elgin Estates in Port Elgin to permit 113-249 apartments; and Official Plan and Zoning changes to permit up to 12 semi-detached dwellings, 22 Townhomes, and a 90-unit retirement residence in the Sauble Sunsets project in Sauble Beach.

A total of 375 new lots or units were created in 2021, compared to 300 in 2020. Approved applications have also created opportunities to increase rental housing supply. Recent projects include a 50-lot subdivision in Port Elgin that will have at least 10 dwellings with apartment units; new townhouses in Kincardine that are being constructed that will each have an additional residential unit; and a project for 8 one-bedroom townhouse units on private services in Hepworth.

"With the Planning and Development Department continuing to see record application numbers, the outlook for 2022 is another strong year of housing development and this will be positive for the economy coming out of the pandemic", says Director of Planning and Development Mark Paoli. "The record number of applications processed reflects the commitment and teamwork of County and Local Municipality staff and we appreciate the community's patience during these busy times."

Bruce County Warden Janice Jackson adds, "Bruce County is a wonderful place to own a business and raise a family, and we continue to see that through the interest in development shown in our record planning application numbers."

The Affordable Housing 101 webpage, found on the Bruce County website, will offer step-by-step guides, tools, and other resources to support development projects.

Developers, builders, landlords, and homeowners interested in creating affordable housing in Bruce County are encouraged to explore the Affordable Housing 101 Guide at <u>www.brucecounty.on.ca/affordable-housing-101</u>.

In future phased updates to the Affordable Housing Toolkit, three toolkits will be launched, tailored to developers of multiresidential buildings, developers and builders of low to medium density housing, and homeowners or landlords who could intensify their properties. These toolkits will build on the Affordable Housing 101 Guide.

It is broadly accepted that housing is affordable when a household is not spending more than 30% of its income on housing costs. The province has also defined affordable housing thresholds for households of low and moderate income. For ownership housing, the affordable housing threshold is housing that is affordable to households with incomes at the 60th percentile. For renter households, the affordable housing threshold is 100% of average market rent as published by Canada Mortgage Housing Corporation (CMHC). In Bruce County, the affordable housing thresholds for 2020 were rents below \$1,014 and ownership costs below \$346,600.

"Bruce County is home to many thriving, vibrant communities. However, there is work to be done to ensure the provision of safe, affordable, and suitable housing for all," says Christine MacDonald, Director of Human Services. "Increasing the affordable housing stock is a key strategy in Bruce County's Housing and Homelessness Plan."

"Working with local developers and landlords to create affordable housing options is imperative for the continued success of our residents, communities, and economies," adds Bruce County Warden Janice Jackson. "Together, we can create the housing we need to sustain a healthy and prosperous future for Bruce County."

Bruce County partners with Local Colleges for Early Childhood Education Bursaries

Bruce County Children's Services has partnered with Fanshawe College and Georgian College to provide \$80,000 in Bruce County Early Childhood Education Bursaries to eligible students.

Bruce County Children's Services has partnered with Fanshawe College and Georgian College to provide \$80,000 in Bruce County Early Childhood Education Bursaries to eligible students. This initiative supports ongoing efforts to retain and recruit a high-quality child care and early years workforce and is supported with funds from the August 2021 signing of the Early Childhood Workforce Funding Agreement by Canada and Ontario.

The collaboration will offer students who meet identified criteria the chance to apply for one of 20 bursaries available to encourage students to enter the field of Early Childhood Education at either institution. Eligible students could potentially receive up to a maximum of \$4,000 in total bursaries, covering approximately half of their tuition costs over the two-year Early Childhood Education diploma program.

Disbursement of the bursaries will begin in the 2022/2023 academic year (September to August) and eligibility will end upon the students' completion of their early childhood education program. Students are eligible for the bursary if, at the time of selection, they:

Demonstrate financial need as determined by a budget submission.

Are a full-time domestic student entering their first year of Fanshawe College's Early Childhood Education diploma program or Georgian College's Early Childhood Education diploma program.

Are in good academic standing.

Have self-identified as having a Bruce County home address on their application.

"The key objectives of this partnership are to sustain, enhance, grow, and attract an increasingly diverse early childhood education workforce," says Tina Metcalfe, Bruce County's Manager of Children's Services. "This bursary opportunity will help Bruce County students join the caring and dedicated child care and early years professionals across Bruce County".

Bruce County Warden Janice Jackson adds, "Early Childhood Educators are integral to the provision of high quality child care and early years programming for families in Bruce County. We encourage all those interested in early childhood education to pursue this rewarding career in our beautiful and engaged communities".
