Background:

The Community Services Department plans and runs annual programming and events such as fitness classes, the Winter Carnival, Wolf Cub Adventure Camp, minor soccer and baseball and the Ripley Food Art Craft Festival.

Discussion:

The June Outdoor Fitness Bootcamp wrapped up with instructor Melissa Dozois. Staff is working with Melissa to develop an evening Gentle Stretch and Strengthen class that includes low impact yoga and Pilates-based movement and a Let's Move program, a low impact fitness class focusing on mobility, strength, coordination and balance. These programs would potentially run for the month of August.

The Ripley Wolf Cub Adventure Camp registration is full for all 4 weeks of camp this summer. Each week the campers will have a chance to visit the BBFG, the Ripley Splashpad, a swim at Lucknow Pool, themed crafts, games and activities.

Special events for camp include a visit from Ripley-Huron Fire Department, South Bruce OPP and a trip to MacGregor Provincial Park and the rental of a 35-foot inflatable slip and slide.

Pickleball continues to be a popular sport in Huron-Kinloss. We currently have 28 people registered and continue to receive more registrations each week.

Plans for the Ripley Food, Art and Craft Festival continue to move forward. We have 29 confirmed vendors and continue to market and promote the event. Staff will be working together to finalize details in the coming weeks.
