THAT the Township of Huron-Kinloss Committee of the Whole hereby approves Report Number PW2022-05-35 prepared by John Yungblut, Director of Public Works AND accepts the tender from Royal Fence Limited in the amount of \$167,530.00 plus HST for the construction of chain link fencing at the Huron Landfill AND FURTHER authorizes the appropriate by-law coming forward.

Background:

Township staff issued request for quotation number PW2022-04-22 for the construction of a chain link fence along the north boundary of the Huron Landfill. The purpose the fencing is to prevent litter from migrating off site and deter trespassing onto the site. This project was originally tendered in 2020, however the bid submitted exceeded the amount budgeted, so it was not awarded. It was retendered in 2021 and awarded, however the contractor failed to complete any portion of the work.

Discussion:

One compliant bid and one non-compliant bid was received:

Bidder	Tender Amount (not incl. HST)
Royal Fence Limited	\$167,530.00 (compliant)
Neptune Security Service Ltd.	\$457,500.00 (no bid deposit submitted)

Royal Fence Limited is located in London, Ontario and has completed guiderail replacement work for the Township in 2020 and 2021. Township staff have had no concerns with the quality of their work, and we are confident they will be able to complete this project. With the ongoing litter issues and after-hours activity on the site, Township staff recommend proceeding work despite the fact it is over budget.

Financial Impacts:

The 2022 Capital Budget allocated \$150,000 for this project. Savings will have to be found elsewhere in the budget to fund this project.
