

Before attempting to clear a blocked sewer or septic pipe, it's important to call Ontario One Call toll free at 1-800-400-2255 for a free sewer safety inspection. In rare cases, underground natural gas pipelines could unintentionally run through sewer or septic pipes - this is called a cross bore. Cross bores can result in a dangerous natural gas leak if equipment used to unclog the pipes damages the natural gas line.
