Local writer, fiddler, and photographer Will Henry joins the Bruce County Museum & Cultural Centre for the second in its Muse-Talk Academic Lecture Series on April 13 from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM for an evening of music and insights about fiddle culture.

This talk will include live traditional music and a slideshow of Henry's photographs taken over forty years following fiddle culture and some of the changes he has observed. He will also play some of the original fiddle tunes from his new book, *Juggling the Notes*, and some traditional music with his wife Lynda on concertina.

Hailing from the Owen Sound area, Henry is known for both his fiddling with the contra dance band Scatter the Cats, and his

twenty-five years as a journalist with the Owen Sound Sun Times. Combining his interests in music, photography, and writing, he produced *Juggling the Notes* after many years of exploring and documenting fiddle culture and creating his own original tunes within the tradition. Residents of Bruce County are encouraged to remove hazardous waste materials from their homes, garages, and basements and dispose of them in an environmentally safe manner.

Residents of Bruce County are encouraged to remove hazardous waste materials from their homes, garages, and basements and dispose of them in an environmentally safe manner. To assist with this cleanup effort, Bruce County will be hosting thirteen Household Hazardous Waste Collection events in designated locations across the County in 2022.

Household hazardous waste materials include: paints and stains, propane tanks, used oil, aerosols, batteries, antifreeze, oil filters, solvents, household cleaners, fluorescent lights, fertilizers, fuel, pharmaceuticals, fire extinguishers, pesticides, and pool chemicals. Waste must be received in containers that can be disposed of. Containers will not be emptied and returned (ie. gas cans). Empty metal paint cans are blue box recyclable.

Attendees must remain in their vehicle with windows closed and with waste materials in their open trunk only for unloading. Please do not attend if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

Bruce County will be taking all precautions reasonable for their staff and contractors to operate these events during COVID-19. We require resident's adherence to the protocols in place to deliver this service. The County retains the right to refuse service if protocols are not being followed.

The guide contains a first look at the major exhibits that will be hosted at the Museum this summer, beginning in May with the opening of Sonic Sensation—an interactive exhibit that will allow visitors of all ages to make some noise while exploring the science of sound in our everyday world.

Brant Tract Remains Closed for Post-Harvest Clean-Up

The Brant Tract timber harvest is now complete and the site will remain closed as trail repairs and tract clean-up are set to begin.

The Brant Tract timber harvest is now complete and the site will remain closed as trail repairs and tract clean-up are set to begin. Bruce County Transportation & Environmental Services estimates that trails will reopen in 3 to 4 weeks. This closure will also keep additional damage from occurring as the property is experiencing high water levels and soft surfaces due to the spring thaw. The public is asked to be respectful of the closure while clean-up is being completed.

The Brant Tract property is located between Concession 12 and the Brant-Elderslie Townline, east of Bruce Road 3, within the Municipality of Brockton. Harvesting was conducted to improve forest health as part of the County's Forest Management Plan.
